## PSC Schedules Public Hearing in Watford City for Proposed Crude Oil Pipeline Conversion Project

BISMARCK, ND – The North Dakota Public Service Commission (PSC) will hold a public hearing in Watford City on Tuesday, April 10, regarding a proposal to convert an existing gathering pipeline system to a transmission pipeline system in McKenzie County.

Hess North Dakota Pipelines, LLC, has submitted an application to convert approximately 19 miles of 10-inch and 16-inch crude oil gathering pipeline into a transmission line. Because the line is already existing, the project would include minimal construction and above-ground disturbances, but booster pumps would be added to the pipeline in three different locations. The transmission pipeline would have a normal throughput of 100,000 barrels per day, but a maximum capacity of 160,000 barrels per day. Estimated cost of the project is \$107 million.

The mainline would start at Hess' existing Hawkeye Oil Facility and extend in a southerly direction with connections to the existing Crestwood Arrow Facility and the Dakota Access Pipeline Terminal. People with concerns, questions or support/opposition for the project are encouraged to attend the hearing and present their information. <u>Information received after the hearing will not be part of the official record and cannot be used as a basis for the Commission's decision unless certain additional procedures are followed.</u>
