NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

September 21, 2016

On September 1, 2016, Otter Tail Power Company (Otter Tail) filed an annual update to its Transmission Facility Cost Recovery Rider tariff. On September 14, 2016, Otter Tail filed an update proposing to spread its estimated over-collection of the true-up over both 2017 and 2018 thereby resulting in a smaller decrease for 2017 and an estimated smaller increase for 2018. The proposed rate decrease for 2017 includes updated electric transmission expenses with offsetting revenues and a true-up amount from the current rate. The proposed rate adjustment to be effective for bills rendered on and after January 1, 2017, is as follows:

All Other Service	\$0.00680 /kWh	\$0.00475	\$(0.00205)


The decrease for a typical residential customer using 1000 kWh per month would be \$2.05 per month. The issues to be considered in this proceeding are:

1. Whether the proposed rate adjustment complies with Otter Tail's tariff,
2. Whether the incurred costs for new or modified electric transmission facilities are reasonable and prudent, and
3. Whether the incurred costs are eligible for recovery through the transmission cost recovery rider.

Those interested are invited to comment on the application in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. **Comments and requests for hearing must be received by November 7, 2016.** If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a hearing.


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
