Mr. Cramer: I move the Commission adopt the following revisions to its policy on compensatory time.

With prior approval of the employee's supervisor, an exempt employee will be granted hour for hour compensatory (comp) time for hours worked in excess of 45 hours during a regular work week, Monday through Friday. In addition, if an employee is required to work a weekend day or holiday, the employee will be granted hour for hour comp time for the hours worked on the weekend or holiday.

Also, with prior supervisor approval, comp time may be earned for time spent traveling and attending conferences on weekends and holidays. Weekend travel time eligible to earn comp time must be determined by the most efficient travel method, unless the employee is required to use another method. A maximum of 8 hours per day of comp time may be earned for time spent traveling and attending conferences on weekends and holidays. No comp time will normally be earned for any extra time spent traveling and attending out-of-state conferences Monday through Friday (except for holidays), but special circumstances may be addressed by the supervisor on a case-by-case basis.

Earned comp time should be used as soon as possible, preferably within the same pay period in which it was earned. However, an employee who has earned comp time shall use the earned comp time within 60 days of completion of the project on which the comp time was earned, unless extended by the supervisor. An employee may not earn or use comp time in increments smaller than $\frac{1}{2}$ hour.

In order to receive comp time for extra hours worked an employee must:

1) Request and receive prior approval from the employee's supervisor to work the additional hours. This request must include reasons why the required work schedule cannot be accommodated by the PSC's normal flextime policy.

2) Provide the supervisor prior notice before taking any comp time for hours that have accrued. Comp time must be taken in a manner that does not interfere with assigned duties and work, and using earned comp time is subject to the supervisor's approval. The hours of comp time taken must be charged to the same project on which they were accrued.

3) Report the earning and use of comp time in the same manner as reporting and using holiday time and

other forms of leave.

4) All requests for comp time and all supervisor approvals must be supported by written documentation.

Supervisors have discretion to approve variations from this policy in special situations, so long as the variation does not violate another relevant PSC policy. Under PSC Policy No. 3-11-96(3), the work week begins on Saturday.

Any abuse of the time policy may result in termination of its use and other disciplinary action.
