<u>Warehouse Capacity</u>	<u>1-Year License Fee</u>
1 bushel – 200,000 bushels	\$300.00
200,001 bushels – 500,000 bushels	\$450.00
501,000 bushels and over	\$550.00
Late fee per warehouse for a renewal received after July 15 th	\$100.00

<u>Warehouse Capacity</u>	<u>2-Year License Fee</u>
1 bushel – 200,000 bushels	\$600.00
200,001 bushels – 500,000 bushels	\$900.00
501,000 bushels and over	\$1,100.00
Late fee per warehouse for a renewal received after July 15 th	\$200.00

Warehouse Capacity: A licensee’s warehouse capacity is determined by the licensee’s total physical capacity licensed in the state. Warehouse capacity includes main warehouse, annexes, other bins, farm storage, ground storage, leased space, etc.

North Dakota Century Code section 60-02-07 provides:

. . . When a public warehouseman operates more than one warehouse in the same city or siding, in conjunction with each other and with the same working force, and keeps one set of books and records for all such warehouses, and issues one series of scale tickets, warehouse receipts, checks, and credit-sale contracts for the grain stored and purchased therein, only one license is required for the operation of all such warehouses. When two or more warehouses are operated under one license, the license fee is based upon the combined bushel capacity of the warehouses. . . .
