Fraud Prevention Policy

Mr. Cramer: I move the Commission adopt Policy 1-27-10 on fraud prevention. PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION FRAUD PREVENTION Policy 1-27-10 (0) October 6, 2010

A. PURPOSE

The North Dakota Public Service Commission has a zero tolerance for fraud and establishes this policy to facilitate the development of controls that will aid in the detection and prevention of fraud against the Commission. It is the intent of the Commission to promote consistent organizational behavior by providing guidelines and assigning responsibility for the development of controls and conduct of investigations.

B. POLICY

Applicability and Definitions

This policy applies to any fraudulent, or suspected fraudulent act, involving employees as well as stakeholders, consultants, vendors, contractors, outside agencies doing business with employees of such agencies, and/or any other parties with a business relationship with the Commission.

Fraud is defined as the intentional workplace deception: lying, cheating, and stealing or the use of one's position for personal enrichment through the deliberate misuse or misapplication of the State's resources or assets. Fraud is a criminal offense, and a civil law violation.

If there is any question as to whether an action constitutes fraud, contact the General Counsel.

Internal control plays an important role in the prevention and detection of fraud.

Fraud Prevention Policy (Continued)

Examples of internal controls are:

- Segregation of duties separating authorization, custody, and record keeping roles to limit risk of fraud or error by one person.
- Authorization of transactions review of particular transactions by an appropriate person.
- Retention of records maintaining documentation to substantiate transactions.
- Supervision or monitoring of operations observation or review of ongoing operational activity.
- Physical safeguards usage of items such as locks and physical barriers to protect property and may include the use of cameras for monitoring.
- Analysis of results periodic and regular operational reviews, inventories, metrics, and other key performance indicators.
- IT Security usage of items such as passwords and access logs to ensure access restricted to authorized personnel.

Everyone in an organization has responsibility for internal control to some extent. Virtually all employees produce information used in the internal control system or take other actions needed to effect control.

Reporting of Fraudulent Acts

An employee with a reasonable basis for believing that a fraudulent act has occurred in the workplace has a responsibility to report the suspected act in a timely manner.

Reports should be made to the employee's immediate supervisor, unless the employee suspects that the supervisor has participated in or condoned the act. In that case, the employee should report the matter to the next highest level of supervision or management.

This policy does not prohibit prompt notification to appropriate authorities when an immediate threat to personal safety exists or other circumstances justify such notice. Upon discovering evidence of a possible fraudulent act, employees should not confront individuals suspected of wrongdoing or initiate a fraud investigation because such actions may compromise any ensuing investigation.

Fraud Prevention Policy (Continued)

Employees should not make statements or disclosures knowing they are false or in reckless disregard of the truth.

The Commission will perform a fraud risk assessment for its functions and divisions.

Investigation Responsibilities

The Commission has the responsibility to investigate all suspected fraudulent acts. If the investigation substantiates that fraudulent activities have occurred, the Commission shall take appropriate action. Final decision on disposition of the case will be determined by the Commission.

If a Commissioner is suspected of fraud, the suspected fraud shall be reported to the Director of the Office of Management and Budget and the Attorney General.

Great care must be taken in the investigation of suspected improprieties or irregularities so as to avoid mistaken accusations or alerting suspected individuals that an investigation is under way.

Administration

The Executive Secretary and the General Counsel are responsible for the administration of this policy.

I move the Commission waive the current and potential conflicts and perceived conflicts identified in the memorandum and consent to Richard J. Savelkoul representing the Commission and to the firm's continued representation of the identified parties in the future to the extent of and in the capacity described in the memorandum.

I further move the Commission retain Richard J. Savelkoul of Felhaber Larson Fenlon and Vogt, to provide legal services to the Commission as advocacy staff counsel in Case No. PU-10-124, Montana-Dakota Utilities Co., Electric Rate Increase Application.
