

Pipelines are by far the safest, cleanest, most reliable and economical way to transport energy resources across America.

Pipeline Maps

To reference overview maps of pipelines in your area visit the National Pipeline Mapping System (NPMS). This online tool should never be used as a substitute for contacting 811 or ND One Call prior to any excavation activities.

Recognizing a Pipeline Leak

Any of these indicators might let you know that a pipeline leak has occurred:

Sight: Dead or discolored vegetation along a pipeline Right-of-Way, bubbling in standing water, vapor clouds or frozen soil, fire shooting from the ground, or oily sheen on ground or water.

Smell: Rotten eggs (sulfur) or hydrocarbon scents (NOTE some natural gas transmission pipelines are not odorized).

Sound: Hissing or blowing or a loud roaring like that of a jet engine.

Call - or Click -Before You Dia!



Unauthorized excavation by third parties is a leading cause of pipeline damages.

If you are planning a digging activity remember to call 811 or North Dakota One Call at least 48 hours prior to any digging. You can also visit www.ndonecall.com and click ITIC lite and create your ticket online. If you are a professional contractor, call 701-475-2942 for further instructions

Making the appropriate One Call decreases the risk of damaging buried utilities. Once the notification is made, a pipeline representative will visit the dig site and mark the location of the underground facilities. This is a free service for homeowners.
