

For 50 years Operation Lifesaver (OL) has been the leading national non-profit organization for rail safety education, committed to preventing <u>collisions</u>, <u>injuries</u>, <u>and fatalities</u> on and around railroad tracks and highway-rail grade crossings for pedestrians <u>and</u> vehicles of all types.

Operation Lifesaver of the Dakotas provides rail safety information and resources across both North Dakota and South Dakota through public education and awareness. Five participating ND rails — Burlington Norther Santa Fe; Canadian Pacific; Dakota Missouri Valley & Western; Northern Plains; and Red River Valley & Western railroads, along with the Operation Lifesaver Committee and North Dakota Safety Council, work collectively in this mission. There is approxmalty 3,330 active rail track miles across North Dakota (NDDOT Rail Plan 2017) with 290 incorporated communities impacted by rails totaling almost 80% of all ND communities (undocumented source).

Data is essential for decision making regarding incident information, location, and common demographics. The most recent data confirms:

- ✓ Both urban and rural incidents occur; distractions and human error are key factors;
- ✓ The concern for 'near-miss' incidents is growing and of great concern;
- ✓ Isolated / random nature of incidents make identification of trends difficult; and,
- ✓ In the past 12 months, North Dakota had 3 fatalities (1 pedestrian, 1 motorcycle, 1 vehicle).

Public education and awareness are primarily delivered through:

- Social media Facebook, radio, newspaper, with 2 specific campaigns Bakken Blitz (April/May) and Rail Safety Week (September).
- Education & events free presentations are provided to school and community groups;
 OL hosts booths during community and statewide events to disseminate educational and promotional material and discuss rail safety. [2021 dissemination of materials exceeded 31,000 to more than 9400 individuals].
- Partnerships help expand our reach and common messages of safety (i.e. NDSC Traffic Safety, ND Game & Fish, NDDOT).

Operation Lifesaver 2022-2023 goals:

- ✓ Continue public awareness, education and partnerships to the identified target areas described below, including children and special populations
- ✓ Expand presentation efforts and partnerships in South Dakota
- ✓ Re-activate volunteer base which was on hold for two years as a result of COVID-19

OL budget: approximately \$75,000/yr. from ND DOT, railroad contributions and FRA

DID YOU NOW?

The average freight train weighs approximately **6**,**000** tons. The weight ratio of a car to a train is proportional to a soda can and a car.

SAFETY TIP: Approach crossings with care. Slow down when you see an advanced warning sign.

A 100-car freight train traveling at 55 miles per hour will need more than a **mile** to stop once the train is set into emergency braking.

SAFETY TIP: If your vehicle stalls on the tracks, get out immediately and locate the railroad's emergency number or call 911.

There are approximately **140,000** miles of railroad tracks in the United States.

SAFETY TIP: Expect a train at every crossing. Always look both ways and listen for the sound of an approaching train.

Trains have the right of way **100%** of the time – even over ambulances, fire engines and the police.

SAFETY TIP: Always yield to an approaching train. Driving around lowered gates is not only dangerous, it's illegal.

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
