

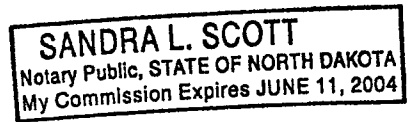

ORDER

February 14, 2001

On August 1, 1999, substantial changes to North Dakota's telecommunications laws took effect due to the enactment of Senate Bill 2420. One new subsection allows U S WEST Communications, Inc. (U S WEST) to raise the price of its local residential service to \$15.50 after July 31, 1999 (Phase I) and to \$18.00 after June 30, 2000 (Phase II). The law requires U S WEST to use the increased revenues from the residential price increase to reduce the price of access and intraLATA toll in a revenue neutral and competitively neutral manner.

On June 9, 2000, U S WEST filed Phase II revisions to its intraLATA toll price schedules, Case No. PU-314-00-289 as well as its access service price schedules, Case No. PU-314-00-290.

On June 27, 2000, U S WEST filed a report required under SB 2420 of the competitive and revenue neutrality of its toll and access price schedule revisions. The filing included an application for trade secret protection of confidential information in the report, which was responded to by Commission staff on July 6, 2000 and granted by the Commission on July 19, 2000.

On August 16, 2000, in Case Nos. PU-314-99-419 and PU-314-99-420, the Commission found that U S WEST had reasonably demonstrated the competitive and revenue neutrality of its Phase I price changes.

On November 7, 2001 U S West filed an application for trade secret protection of confidential information included in responses to Commission staff information requests. Staff responded on November 14, 2001 and trade secret protection was granted by the Commission on November 21, 2001.

On January 10, 2002, Commission staff filed a memorandum indicating the results of its Phase II review. Based on actual first-year data provided by U S WEST, Staff concluded that revenues from Phase II increases appear to have been more than offset by decreases in toll and access rates and that those decreases have resulted in approximately equal percentage reductions in toll and access revenues.


The Commission finds that U S WEST has reasonably demonstrated that it has reduced the prices of intrastate intraLATA message toll service and intrastate switched access, as such prices existed on January 1, 1999, in aggregate by an annual amount not less than the annual revenue increases resulting from the local service price changes authorized under SB 2420.

The Commission finds that U S WEST has reasonably demonstrated that it has reduced the prices of intrastate intraLATA message toll service and intrastate switched access by similar percentages in a competitively neutral manner.


Order

The Commission Orders that Case Nos. PU-314-00-289 and PU-314-00-290 be closed..

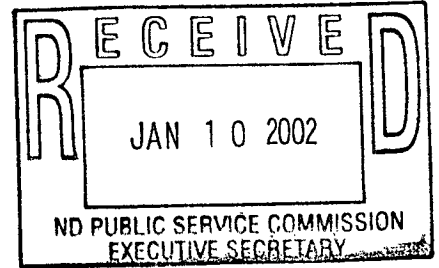

Re: SB2420 Phase II Access and MTS Rate Rebalancing, Case Nos. PU-314-00-289 and PU-314-00-290.

SB 2420 required U S WEST (now Qwest) to file a report reasonably demonstrating that revenues from SB 2420 authorized increases in the price of local services were offset by competitively neutral equal percentage decreases in toll and access rates. Phase II rates have now been in effect since July 1, 2001. Based on actual first-year data it appears SB 2420 revenue increases have been offset by decreases in toll and access rates that have resulted in approximately equal percentage reductions in toll and access revenues.

Qwest filed its initial Phase II report on June 27, 2000. The report used forecasted sales volumes to project a Phase II first-year local service revenue increase of \$4,086,851 and an offsetting decrease in toll and access revenues of \$4,315,107. The projections included a reduction of approximately \$200,000 to offset estimated net revenue from the August, 1999 directory assistance price increases, as Qwest agreed to do when stipulating to dismiss the appeal in Case No. PU-314-98-229. The report projected approximately equal percentage decreases (19.52%) in revenues from toll and access services.

Staff discovered some numerical errors in the initial report and questioned the accuracy of Qwest's projections. In response to staff discovery requests, Qwest ~~West~~ provided corrections to the original report and a revised report based on actual customer volumes and usages for the first-year period July 2000 through June 2001.

The Commission has granted trade secret protection for the discovery responses such that actual numbers cannot be provided in this memo. However, based on the actual first-year numbers of customers and usage volumes reported by Qwest, it appears that revenues from SB 2420 Phase II increases and the August, 1999 directory assistance increase have been more than offset by decreases in toll and access rates that have resulted in approximately equal percentage reductions in toll and access revenues.





ORDER GRANTING TRADE SECRET PROTECTION

November 21, 2001

On November 8, 2001, Qwest Corporation f/k/a U S WEST Communications, Inc. (U S WEST) filed an application for a protective order limiting the disclosure of trade secret information included in U S WEST's response to Commission staff's request for information in these proceedings.

U S WEST provides the general description of the nature of the information sought to be protected as information regarding revenues from minutes for use for intraLATA toll and access services, as well as information regarding revenues from and numbers of residential customers for local exchange service. U S WEST notes the Commission issued an order granting trade secret protection for similar information in these proceedings on July 19, 2000.

U S WEST states that the information for which it seeks trade secret protection contains confidential and proprietary information regarding numbers of customers, number of toll and switched access minutes, and revenues derived from the sale of local exchange services, message toll service and wholesale access service. U S WEST states that the information is considered and treated by U S WEST to be confidential and proprietary and is not publicly disseminated. In a competitive telecommunications market place this information is highly sensitive and its public disclosure would place U S WEST at a significant competitive disadvantage.

- b. Is the subject of efforts that are reasonable under the circumstances to maintain its secrecy.



Staff believes the application satisfies the requirements of the law that allow the Commission to grant trade secret protection and recommended granting the application. Staff noted that the Commission's process provides a means for interested parties to review trade secret documents upon signing a nondisclosure agreement.

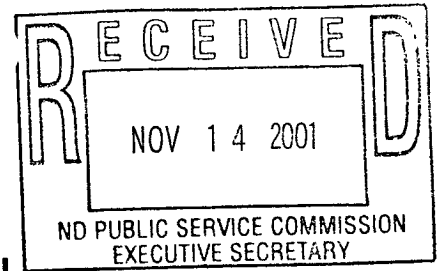



4. The General Description of the Persons or Entities that Would Obtain Economic Value from Disclosure or Use of the Information.

Competitors or potential competitors of Qwest that provide local exchange service and message toll service would obtain economic value from disclosure or use of the information.

5. A Specific Description of Known Competitors or Competitor's Goods and Services that are Pertinent to the Information.



4. There appears to be an inconsistency in the average rate per minute for MTS used in the trade secret protected work papers discussed in request #1 above. Please provide complete work papers detailing calculations with sources for all data relied upon when determining the average rate per minute for MTS prior to implementing SB 2420 stage 2 rates.



ORDER GRANTING TRADE SECRET PROTECTION

July 19, 2000

On June 27, 2000, U S WEST Communications, Inc. (U S WEST) filed an application for a protective order limiting the disclosure of trade secret information filed in the captioned proceedings. U S WEST seeks trade secret protection for the report required by Senate Bill 2420 reasonably demonstrating the revenue neutrality of the new price schedules for residential local exchange service.

U S WEST states that the information it seeks to protect contains confidential and proprietary information which includes the minutes of use for intraLATA toll and access and/or information that would allow a person to calculate this information. Additionally, the documents contain confidential and proprietary information regarding numbers of customers, or information that would allow someone to derive this information. U S WEST states that in a competitive telecommunications market place, this type of information is highly sensitive and that its public disclosure would place U S WEST at a significant competitive disadvantage.

U S WEST states that the information it seeks to protect is proprietary to U S WEST and is available only to those employees and representatives who have a need to know the information to perform their duties and responsibilities, and that it does not disclose this information outside the company except pursuant to the terms of strict agreements or orders to maintain the confidentiality of the information. U S WEST states that competitors or potential competitors would obtain economic value from the disclosure or use of the information.

On July 6, 2000, Commission Staff responded that it believes the application satisfies the requirements of law which allow the Commission to grant trade secret protection. Staff noted that the Commission's rules and process provide a means for interested parties to review trade secret documents upon signing a nondisclosure agreement. Staff recommended approval of U S WEST's application for trade secret protection in these cases.

N.D. Admin. Code § 69-02-09-04 identifies the procedure to be followed for trade secret requests, and requires that the "commission staff examine the information and application and make a prima facie recommendation of whether the information is relevant and a trade secret under the definition of trade secret in North Dakota Century Code section 47-25.1-01."

N.D.C.C. § 47-25.1-01(4) defines the term "trade secret" as follows:

"Trade secret' means information, including a formula, pattern, compilation, program, device, method, technique, or process, that:




- a. Derives independent economic value, actual or potential, from not being generally known to, and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by, other persons who can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use; and
- b. Is the subject of efforts that are reasonable under the circumstances to maintain its secrecy."

We find that the information for which trade secret protection is requested is relevant to the proceedings and that the information is trade secret.

Order

The Commission orders that the application of U S WEST for trade secret protection is GRANTED.

On June 9, 2000, U S WEST filed new price schedules for residential local exchange service, switched access, and message toll service associated with the second phase of changes allowed by SB 2420. As in the first phase, new revenue realized by any increases to the price of local exchange service is to be applied as decreases to the prices of message toll service and switched access. SB 2420 also requires U S WEST to file a report with the Commission reasonably demonstrating the revenue neutrality of these price changes. An original and seven (7) copies of the report are enclosed with this letter. U S WEST has followed the same procedure as used in the first phase to assure revenue neutrality. Details of the calculations appear in the report. These calculations include the determination of:

- Amount of new revenue generated by residential local exchange rate changes.
- Amount of required reductions.
- Effect of revenue reductions on the Average Per Minute Rates (APMR) of message toll service and switched access.

Proprietary trade secret information has been redacted from the attached copy of the report available for public review. A separate copy of the report containing the proprietary trade secret information is being filed with an application for trade secret protection pursuant to Commission rules.

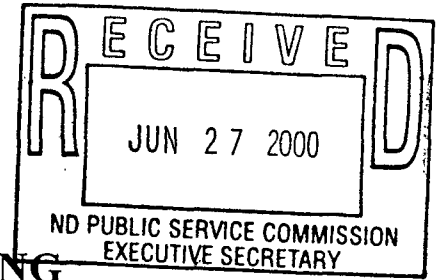

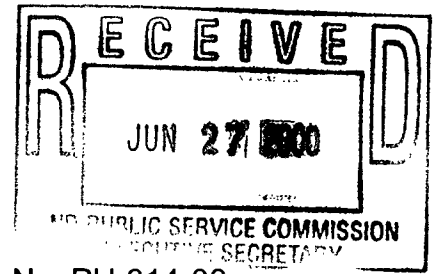

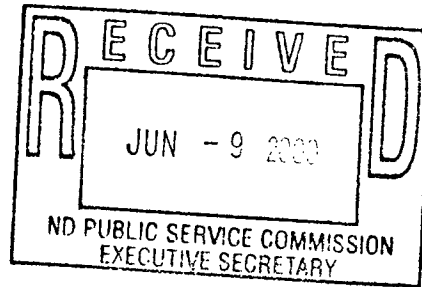
