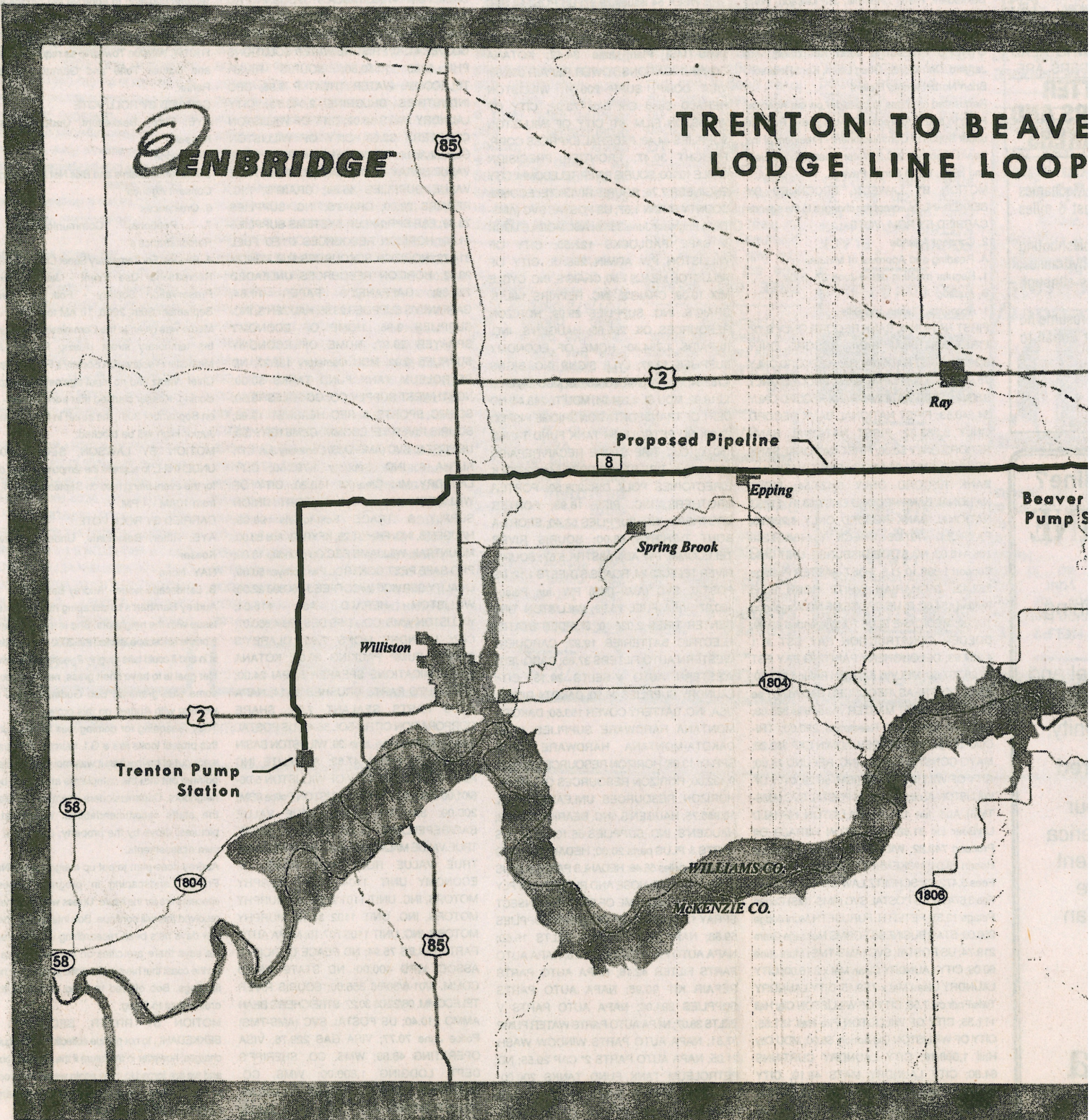
On July 26, 2006, Enbridge Pipelines (North Dakota) LLC (Enbridge) filed a Consolidated Letter of Intent and Application for Waiver or Reduction of Procedures and Time Schedules and for a Corridor Certificate and Route F and parallel to its existing pipeline from the existing Trenton Station to its existing Beaver Lodge Station, all in Williams County.
Enbridge requests that the Commission (1) waive the time period required for separate filing of a Letter of Intent and the one year waiting period for the filing an application; (2) waive the requirement of separate filings of applications and certain time schedules; (3) approve a one mile corridor rather than a 5.2 mile corridor required under North Dakota Administrative Code § 69-06-04-02(1)(b); (4) hold one expedited public hearing on the combined application. If the Commission finds the application is complete.

A public hearing on this matter will be held August 28, 2006 beginning at 10 a.m. CDT (9 a.m. MDT) at the Williston City Hall, Commission Chambers, 22 E Broadway, Williston, ND. Issues to be considered in this matter include:
1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed pipeline facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed pipeline facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed pipeline facilities locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and efficient manner?
4. Are the proposed pipeline facilities of such length, design, location, or purpose that they will produce minimal adverse effects so that procedures and time schedules may be waived?
5. Is it appropriate for the Commission to waive any procedures and time schedules as requested in the application?

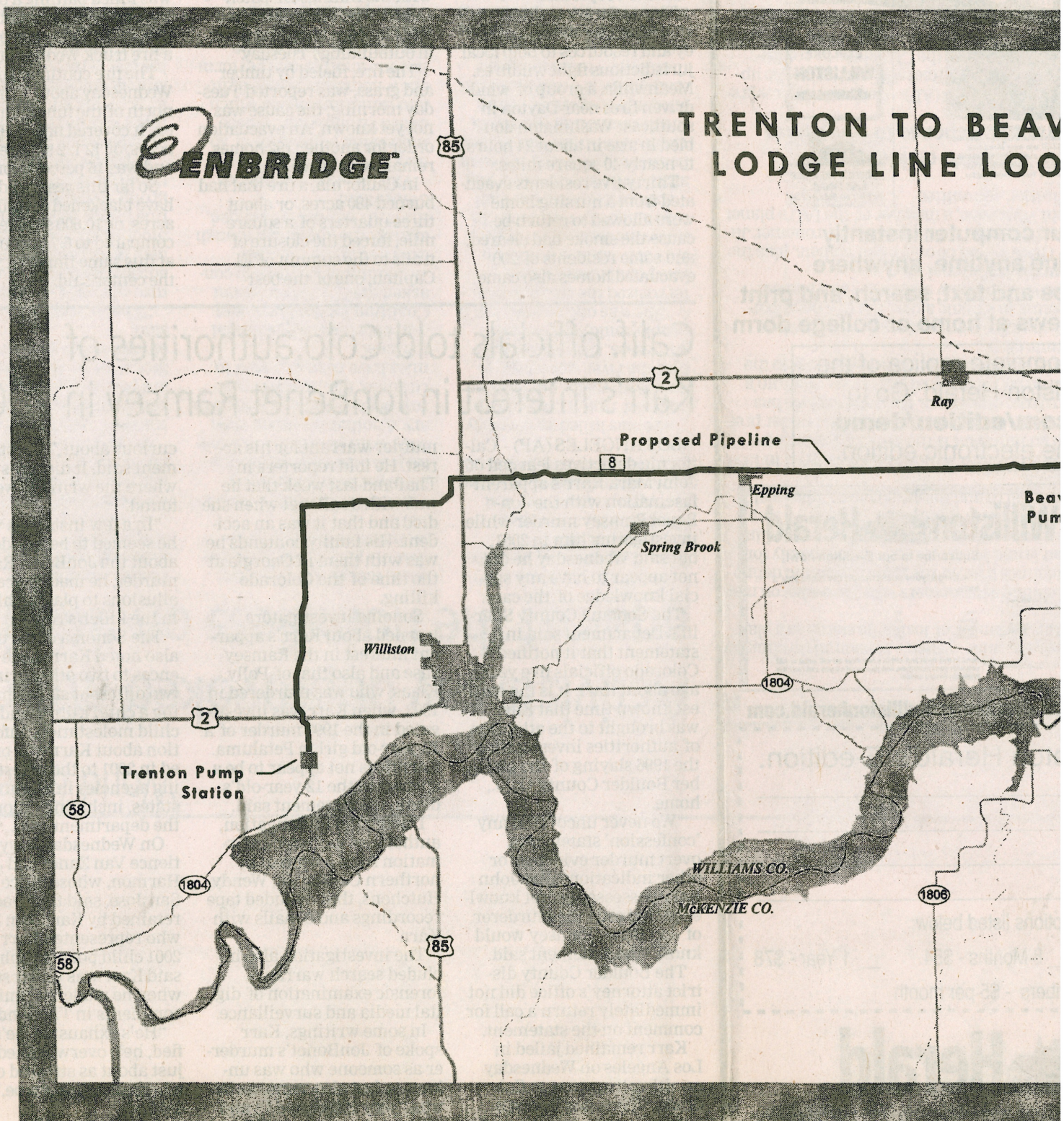
