RE Keystone Pipeline

Good Morning Public Service Commissioners:

North Dakota Public Service Commission needs to know both sides of the ongoing Canadian Keystone Pipeline saga if they are to protect North Dakota's environment and it's residents.

May I ask why you have been led to believe that the concerns of the Landowners from the Lankin / Dahlen area around the Fordville Aquifer have been addressed? After months of deliberation, our questions and concerns have not been fully addressed; instead landowners have been threatened and bullied for civilly speaking out trying find answers to legitimate questions.

No negotiations have been held at all between Keystone and us landowners. Then when we address questions on the EIS , the state comment is to negotiate. HOW?

Chances are the same; the consequences are different. The chance of a leak destroying the water and soil are the same if the pipeline is on top of the Aquifer, 3 miles away, 10 miles away. The consequences are totally different to the amount of damages done, the closer you are the more damage , the further away less damage.

Trans Canada is a Billion dollar foreign company and us landowners who live off this land do not have deep pockets; so we know they (TransCanada) can present more detailed evidence for the case. Is that why we are being walked all over? The question still is why are they allowed access for private gain at the public's expense?

Why should our rights be taken away in the USA? Isn't that what our soldiers are fighting for? Why should you have to fight for something that is already yours? Think About it.
