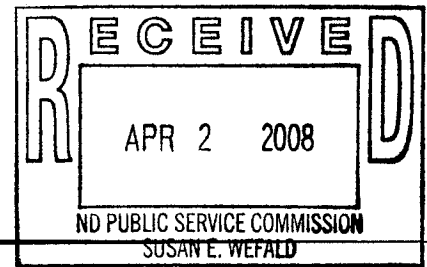

We have received and reviewed **06-0088v TransCanada Keystone Pipeline: "Addendum 5 to Keystone Pipeline Project: Class I, II, and III Cultural Resource Investigations in Eastern North Dakota: Englevale Rail Siding,"** by Andrea Kulevsky (Metcalf Archaeological Consultants, March 2008) and find it acceptable. We concur with the level and scope of identification efforts undertaken in the TransCanada Keystone project APE, as reported. Also, we offer no substantive comments on the report at this time. If consulted either by a federal agency or a state agency, we would concur with recommended **"No Historic Properties Affected"** and **"No Significant Sites Affected"** determinations for site 32RM155 (railroad) provided no effect or no impact occurs as stated and the project takes place in the plotted location.
