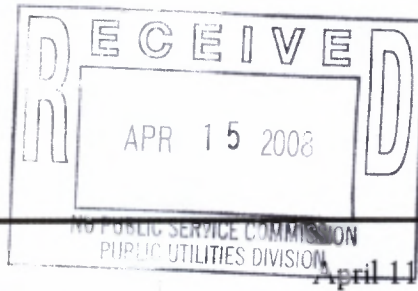

Dear Elizabeth:

We have received and reviewed correspondence for **06-0088cc TransCanada Keystone Pipeline**: "TransCanada Keystone Pipeline: Evaluative Testing at 32RM260, 32WA250, and 32WA251, Ransom and Walsh Counties, North Dakota," by Ed Stine and Andrea Kulevsky (Metcalf Archaeological Consultants, March 2008) and find it acceptable. We concur with the level and scope of evaluation efforts undertaken at the three sites in the TransCanada Keystone project APE, as reported. Also, we offer no substantive comments on the report at this time. We concur with recommended **"No Historic Properties Affected"** and **"No Significant Sites Affected"** determinations for sites 32RM260 and 32WA250, and provided the avoidance plan is followed for significant site 32WA251. Finally, we concur that sites 32RM260 and 32WA250 are not significant and not National Register eligible and that **site 32WA251 is significant and is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.**
