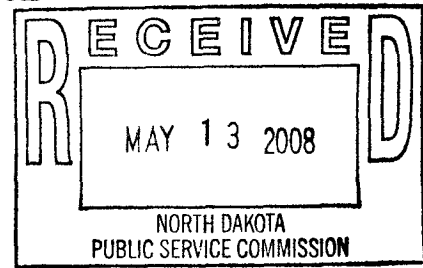

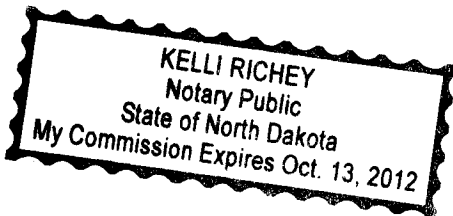

North Dakota. Robin E. Olson, Olson Law, Grand Forks argued the case at the Supreme Court for the defendant.

Loomer had been found guilty of five counts of terrorizing after a bench trial, and sentenced to two years imprisonment on each charge with the sentences to run concurrently.

The terrorizing charges stemmed from an incident in the parking lot at the Sheldon School in April of 2006 where he was accused of firing a shotgun near teenagers.

Loomer argued that he was denied due process when the district court incorrectly informed him of the minimum mandatory sentence. A court must inform a defendant of any mandatory minimum penalty before accepting a plea of guilty.

The defendant and appellant, Loomer, entered a plea of not guilty so the district court was

(as required by the previous sentence) must be a plain, concise, and definite written statement of the essential facts constituting the elements of the offense charged, according to law. There is no requirement that an information duplicate a complaint. Rather, a complaint and information are separate documents.

The Supreme Court found no evidence in the record to support Loomer's contentions.

An opinion on this case was written by Judge Gerald W. VandeWalle, Chief Justice of the North Dakota Supreme Court and signed by VandeWalle, and Justices Carol Ronning Kapsner, Mary Muehlen Maring, Dale V. Sandstrom, and Daniel J. Crothers after reviewing all the information provided. The opinion stated the justices affirmed the district court's judgements and sentences.

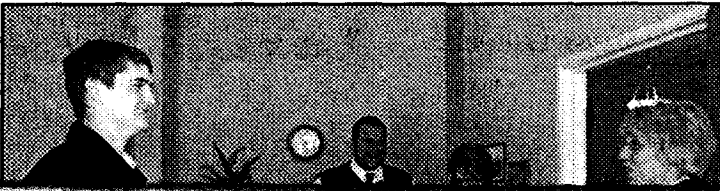

A new spraying service I Oakes contacted Joel and we are going to do mosquito spray and wondered if we would be interested. Will check them out if we need to.

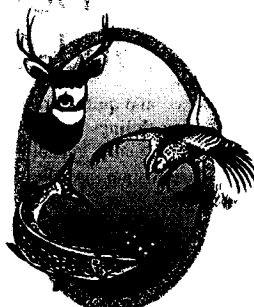
The water break was fixed and will contact N.D. Fire Water and have them come to see if they can help us find the leak.

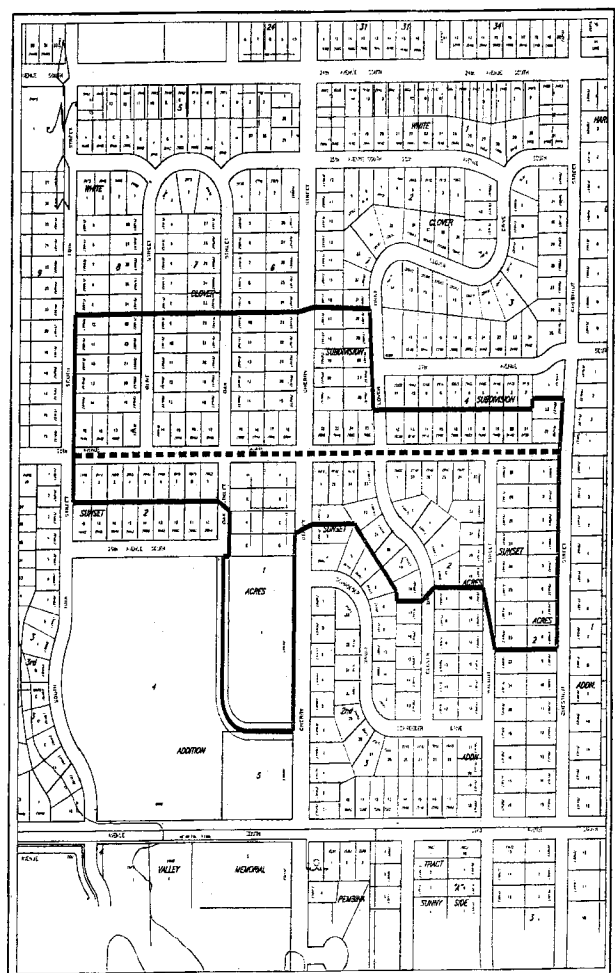

On April 7, 2008 TransCanada Keystone Pipeline, LP (Keystone) filed a Motion for Approval of Reroutes. The reroutes are identified and maps are attached to the application.

The issues to be considered in this proceeding are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed pipeline facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed pipeline facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed pipeline facilities locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

Those interested are invited to comment on the application in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. Comments and requests for hearings must be received by May 19, 2008. If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a hearing.

An Informal Hearing on this application is scheduled to begin Wednesday, May 21, 2008 at 1:30 p.m. in the Commission Hearing Room, 12th Floor, State Capitol, Bismarck, ND 58505.
