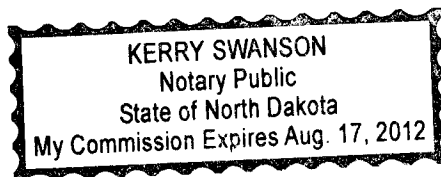

On November 14, 2006 Otter Tail Corporation, d/b/a Otter Tail Power Company, (Otter Tail) filed an application for advance determination of prudence of Otter Tail's participation and ownership interest in the Big Stone II Generating Plant, Case No. PU-06-481.

On November 15, 2006 Montana-Dakota Utilities Co. (Montana-Dakota) filed an application for advance determination of prudence of Montana-Dakota's participation and ownership interest in the Big Stone II Generating Plant, Case No. PU-06-482.

Otter Tail and Montana-Dakota and other utilities proposed to construct a 630 MV pulverized coal facility located adjacent to the existing Big Stone Plant in Big Stone City, South Dakota. The companies are requesting that the Commission determine the construction of Big Stone Unit II generating station to be reasonable and prudent in order to provide the basis for future rate stability proposals the companies will present to the Commission.

A hearing was held on these cases in June, 2007. On September 17, 2007, the applicants notified the Commission that two of the project co-owners withdrew from the project and asked the Commission to suspend further activity on the case until the applicants developed a recommendation on how to proceed. On October 4, 2007, the applicants asked the Commission to supplement the record and on December 11, the applicants asked the Commission to establish a procedural schedule for the supplemental hearing.

1. the agreement (or portion thereof) discriminates against a telecommunications carrier that was not a party to the agreement;

2. the implementation of the agreement (or portion thereof) is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.

In addition, the Commission may include in its review state requirements that do not constitute barriers to entry under section 253. Sec-

tion 252(e)(4) requires that the Commission must act to approve or reject an agreement adopted by negotiation within ninety (90) days after submission by the parties.

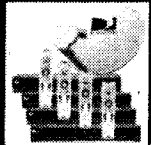

The amendment would add the Hettinger, ND Exchange to Exhibit B, Area of Resale to Attachment 1, Resale, to the General Terms and Conditions of existing the resale area under the existing agreement. This amendment was filed under Section 252(e) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (Act). The Act requires that any agreement adopted by negotiation or arbitration be submitted for approval to the Commission. Under section 252(e)(2)(A), the Commission may only reject an agreement (or portion thereof) adopted by negotiation if it finds that: 1. the agreement (or portion thereof) discriminates against

a telecommunications carrier that was not a party to the agreement;

2. the implementation of the agreement (or portion thereof) is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.

In addition, the Commission may include in its review state requirements that do not constitute barriers to entry under section 253. Section 252(e)(4) requires that the Commission must act to approve or reject an agreement adopted by negotiation within ninety (90) days after submission by the parties. The Commission will receive written comments on these agreements until April 15, 2008.
