**Subject:** RE: FPL wind farm in Langdon - recent filing of wind turbine locations

Attached is a map from FPL comparing the preliminary turbine locations presented at the hearing with the final proposed locations submitted under paragraph 30 of the Commission's May 31, 2007 Order. There does not appear to have been any substantial changes in turbine locations and I recommend no further Commission action is necessary. FPL informs that the only moves relative to nearby homes are:

Turbine 64 moved from 2969' to 3147' or 178' further from the nearest house  
Turbine 44 moved from 3706' to 3538' or 168' closer to the nearest house  
Turbine 9 moved from 4905' to 4572' or 333' closer to the nearest house

**Subject:** Concerns regarding wind farm in Oliver County

Tom – please enter this contact in our public contact system.

Terry Ellis, land owner in Oliver county, but currently residing in Alaska, is not happy with current siting decisions made by Oliver County for FPL on their current wind farm project in Oliver County near Center. FPL is currently constructing their second wind farm in Oliver County, adjacent to their first wind farm. Both FPL wind farms total less than 100 mw and so we do not have siting jurisdiction. A few weeks ago FPL decided that it needed to put several wind towers in new locations and the county zoning board held a hearing on the matter. Three will be placed adjacent to Mr. Ellis' land and all of them will be less than 300 feet from his property line. One will be 150 feet away, and another 200 feet away. He stated that this is less than the fall down distance which he stated is 300 feet. I told him that we did not have jurisdiction over siting the turbines in this case and that his contacts should be made with the county. He has legal representation and has been following this closely. He told me that FPL quickly started construction in the area of the dispute, and that preliminary road work has already occurred.
