

In response to your letter of February 28, 2008 concerning the expansion of the Logan County Wind Farm in Logan County, North Dakota, I am writing to apprise you of geologic information available through the North Dakota Geological Survey that may be of interest to you.

The surface geology of Logan County has been mapped in its entirety on an approximately 1:125,000 scale as part of the ND State Water Commission's County Ground-Water Studies program (Clayton, Lee, 1963, *Glacial Geology of Logan and McIntosh Counties, North Dakota: North Dakota Geological Survey Bulletin 37*, 96 p.). Hydrologic data for Logan County, including lithologic logs of test holes and wells are also available in parts II and III of Bulletin 77 in the same series. All this information is available in paper format from the NDGS offices in Bismarck, and also online at https://www.dmr.nd.gov/ndgs/Publication_List/bulletin.asp (B37 only) and <http://www.swc.state.nd.us/4dlink9/4dcgi/GetContentRecord/PB-266> (B37 and B77).



This department has reviewed the information concerning the above-referenced project submitted under date of February 28, 2008, with respect to possible environmental impacts.

This department believes that environmental impacts from the proposed construction will be minor and can be controlled by proper construction methods. With respect to construction, we have the following comments:

1. All necessary measures must be taken to minimize fugitive dust emissions created during construction activities. Any complaints that may arise are to be dealt with in an efficient and effective manner.
2. Care is to be taken during construction activity near any water of the state to minimize adverse effects on a water body. This includes minimal disturbance of stream beds and banks to prevent excess siltation, and the replacement and revegetation of any disturbed area as soon as possible after work has been completed. Caution must also be taken to prevent spills of oil and grease that may reach the receiving water from equipment maintenance, and/or the handling of fuels on the site. Guidelines for minimizing degradation to waterways during construction are attached.
3. Projects disturbing one or more acres are required to have a permit to discharge storm water runoff until the site is stabilized by the reestablishment of vegetation or other permanent cover. Further information on the storm water permit may be obtained from the Department's website or by calling the Division of Water Quality (701-328-5210). Also, cities may impose additional requirements and/or specific best management practices for construction affecting their storm drainage system. Check with the local officials to be sure any local storm water management considerations are addressed.


4. Noise from construction activities may have adverse effects on persons who live near the construction area. Noise levels can be minimized by ensuring that construction equipment is equipped with a recommended muffler in good working order. Noise effects can also be minimized by ensuring that construction activities are not conducted during early morning or late evening hours.



Dear Mr. Metzger:

We have received and reviewed recent project correspondence for: "07-0098a Bryant Township Wind Farm and Transmission Corridor, Logan County, North Dakota."

Our NDCRS data base and file records indicate that the listed parcels (sections) in question have not been previously inventoried for cultural resources, and as a result there are no recorded sites in or near the project area. There is potential for unrecorded sites in a variety of physiographic settings within the overall project area. We recommend that a Class III Cultural Resource Inventory (pedestrian survey) be conducted for the project area. In particular, when turbine locations, access roads, transmission line corridors, and other areas involving potential ground disturbance are identified we request the opportunity to review this information and the accompanying recommendations for cultural resource inventory investigations. 
Because this information is not based on a comprehensive inventory, there may be species of concern or otherwise significant ecological communities in the area that are not represented in the database. The lack of data for any project area cannot be construed to mean that no significant features are present. The absence of data may indicate that the project area has not been surveyed, rather than confirm that the area lacks natural heritage resources.

Given the potential for not only habitat disturbance and disruption but threat to nesting, feeding and migratory bird and bats in the area we suggest that all efforts be made to avoid impacts to wildlife species and their habitats. In an effort to avoid or minimize impacts to wildlife and their habitats we encourage proper evaluation of all potential wind energy sites. To identify and assess adverse impacts to wildlife we suggest pre and post construction avian and bat monitoring studies be conducted.

Regarding any reclamation efforts, we recommend that any impacted areas be revegetated with species native to the project area.
