On August 1, 2008, Just Wind - Wind Farm Development filed a revised application for a certificate of site compatibility to authorize construction of a 368 MW wind farm consisting of approximately 160 2.3 MW wind turbine generators and associated facilities in Logan County, North Dakota as shown on the attached map.

A Public Hearing on the application is scheduled to begin October 21, 2008 at 10:30 a.m. CDT in the Logan County Courthouse, 301 Broadway, Napoleon, ND 58561. The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

people in the U.S. 70% of them are elderly. The virus hospitalizes another 226,000 annually due to complications from the flu. It's a serious virus that is spread easily from person to person, and immunization can prevent flu in 70% to 90% of healthy adults under 65 who receive the vaccination.

WCHC officials strongly encourage getting the vaccination each year, as the virus changes over time. It is reported that up to 50% of people infected by the influenza virus do not feel ill, but they can still spread the virus to people at risk of complications and death from the flu—infants, the elderly and people with chronic conditions or compromised immune systems.

The Center for Disease Control recommends vaccination for the following groups:

- healthcare workers
- anyone 50 years or older
- children 6 months to 5 years old
- anyone who lives with or cares for a child under 5 or an adult over 50, or someone with health issues
- pregnant women
- residents of nursing homes
- anyone with chronic condition such as asthma or diabetes, a compromised immune system or other conditions that can compromise respiratory function.

WCHC's clinics in Wishek, Napoleon, Kulm and Gackle have flu vaccine on hand and can provide immunizations by appointment.

ANALYSIS OF THE STATEWIDE MEASURES APPEARING ON THE GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT NOVEMBER 4, 2008

The following analyses are for the four measures appearing on the statewide General Election ballot on November 4, 2008. This publication is required by section 16.1-01-07 of the North Dakota Century Code to enable voters to become familiar with the effect of proposed measures. The full text of each measure is available on the Secretary of State's website at www.nd.gov/sos or by requesting a copy from either the Elections Division, Secretary of State's office at (800) 352-0867, ext. 8-4146, or from the office of any County Auditor.

In addition, as required by section 16.1-01-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, a copy of the Legislative Council's report on the estimated fiscal impact of Measures No. 2, No. 3, and No. 4 is available on the Secretary of State's website at www.nd.gov/sos, by calling (800) 352-0867, ext. 8-4146, or by writing to Secretary of State, 600 E Boulevard Avenue Dept 108, Bismarck ND 58505, or from the office of any County Auditor.

Analysis of Constitutional Measure No. 1

Constitutional Measure No. 1 was placed on the ballot by action of

Assembly with the passage of House Concurrent Resolution No. 3045 (2007 Session Laws, Ch. 584). If approved, it would add a new section to article X of the North Dakota Constitution.

This measure would establish a permanent oil tax trust fund from oil and gas tax revenue exceeding one hundred million dollars per biennium, adjusted for inflation; interest earnings on the trust fund would be transferred to the general fund each year; and no more than twenty percent of the principal of the trust fund could be spent each biennium, if approved by three-fourths of the members of both houses of the legislature.

Voting "YES" means you approve the measure as summarized above. Voting "NO" means you reject the measure as summarized above.

Analysis of Initiated Statutory Measure No. 2

Statutory Measure No. 2 was placed on the ballot by petitions circulated by a sponsoring committee. If approved, it would amend sections 57-38-30 and 57-38-30.3 of the North Dakota Century Code. For tax years beginning after December 31, 2008, this initiated measure would lower the state corporate income tax rates by fifteen percent and the adjusted state income tax rates for both resident and nonresident individuals, estates, and trusts by fifty percent, except for one taxpayer

be forty-five percent and for two other brackets where \$10,400 and \$58,000 of income would not be taxed.

Voting "YES" means you approve the measure as summarized above. Voting "NO" means you reject the measure as summarized above.

Analysis of Initiated Statutory Measure No. 3

Statutory Measure No. 3 was placed on the ballot by petitions circulated by a sponsoring committee. If approved, it would add seven new sections to the North Dakota Century Code and amend section 54-27-25.

This measure would establish a tobacco prevention and control advisory committee and an executive committee; develop and fund a comprehensive statewide tobacco prevention and control plan; and create a tobacco prevention and control trust fund to receive tobacco settlement dollars to be administered by the executive committee.

Voting "YES" means you approve the measure as summarized above. Voting "NO" means you reject the measure as summarized above.

Analysis of Initiated Statutory Measure No. 4

Statutory Measure No. 4 was placed on the ballot by petitions circulated by a sponsoring committee. If approved, it would add two new sections to Title 65 of the North Dakota Century Code.

This measure would provide for the appointment by the Governor of the director for the Workforce Safety and Insurance agency, the placement of its employees into the state personnel system, and for the appointment of independent administrative law judges to conduct hearings and make final decisions.

Voting "YES" means you approve the measure as summarized above. Voting "NO" means you reject the measure as summarized above.
