On August 1, 2008, Just Wind - Wind Farm Development filed a revised application for a certificate of site compatibility to authorize construction of a 368 MW wind farm consisting of approximately 160 2.3 MW wind turbine generators and associated facilities in Logan County, North Dakota as shown on the attached map.

A Public Hearing on the application is scheduled to begin October 21, 2008 at 10:30 a.m. CDT in the Logan County Courthouse, 301 Broadway, Napoleon, ND 58561. The issues to be considered are:

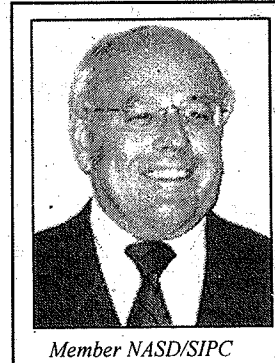
1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human- and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
