NOTICE OF REQUEST TO AMEND CERTIFICATE AND ORDER

AND NOTICE OF HEARING
December 10, 2009

On April 29, 2009, the Commission issued Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order issuing Certificate of Site Compatibility No. 11 to Just Wind - Wind Farm Development (Just Wind). The Certificate authorized construction of all but six proposed wind turbines in a wind farm to be constructed in Logan County, North Dakota. The Commission was concerned with the close proximity of those six turbines to occupied residences and found that more information was needed before authorizing those six turbine locations. On November 10, 2009, Just Wind filed a letter requesting reconsideration of the six turbine locations.

A Public Hearing on reconsidering the six turbine locations is scheduled to begin January 26, 2010 at 11:00 a.m. CST in the Logan County Courthouse, 301 Broadway, Napoleon, ND 58561. The issues to be considered are:

1. Whether the Commission should reconsider its April 29, 2009 Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.
2. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
3. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
4. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
