Pursuant to your request and on behalf of Enbridge Pipeline (North Dakota) LLC (EPND), please find the following information to supplement the application previously filed with the Commission regarding the above-referenced case.

Regarding selection criteria b.(1): Noise sensitive land uses: As identified in Section D.2.c of the Corridor Certificate application, no noise sensitive areas will be affected by the project. The station expansion activities will have a short-term impact on noise levels in the vicinity of the station. Typical construction equipment (e.g., bulldozers, loaders, dump trucks, and backhoes) generate between 80 to 90 decibels within 50 feet of the equipment. This equipment noise will be limited to the period of construction and daylight hours. Because the stations are located in predominantly rural and undeveloped areas, the general public should experience limited nuisance noise. Ambient noise levels are not expected to increase during operation of the facilities as a result of the project.

Regarding selection criteria b.(4): Wooded areas: As identified in Section D.2.c of the Corridor Certificate application, no woodlands or wooded areas will be affected by the project. With the exception of the Beaver Lodge Station, all project activities will occur on lands already owned by EPND. At the Beaver Lodge and Pleasant Lake Stations, an on-site field survey conducted by Merjent, Inc. did not identify any woodlands or wooded areas where project activities would occur outside the existing station facilities (see Exhibit B.3 and B.8 in the aforementioned case application).

Regarding policy criteria (d): Use of citizen coordinating committees: EPND does not propose to utilize citizen coordinating committees on the project.

Regarding policy criteria (f): Labor relations: EPND does not anticipate adverse labor relations for the project. Should a labor dispute arise, it would be the contractor's obligation to resolve the dispute while completing construction.

Regarding policy criteria (j): Other existing or proposed transmission facilities: EPND would upgrade 11 of its existing pumping station facilities to add additional capacity to its existing pipeline facilities. By utilizing existing facilities, impacts to human health and the environment are minimized to the greatest extent practical.

Regarding Section A, #7 of the Waiver Application: Future expansion of the proposed facility: As identified in Section C.1.g of the corridor certificate application, EPND has no further plans to expand its North Dakota System.
