**Enbridge Pipelines (North Dakota) LLC
Pump Station Upgrades
Siting Application**

NOTICE OF HEARING

May 21, 2008

On February 20, 2008 Enbridge Pipelines (North Dakota) LLC (Enbridge) filed an application to amend existing corridor or route permits. Enbridge proposes to upgrade the existing Trenton Station and Beaver Lodge Station in Williams County, Stanley Station and Blaisdell Station in Mountrail County, Minot Station in Ward County, Denbigh Station in McHenry County, Pleasant Lake Station in Benson County, Penn Station and Bartlett Station in Ramsey County, and Larimore Station in Grand Forks County.

Enbridge asserts that these pipeline facilities will produce minimal adverse effects and requests that the Commission (1) waive provisions of law and rule that require filing of separate applications, separate hearings and certain time schedules; (2) not hold a public hearing, but instead publish a notice of opportunity for hearing; (3) find that the proposed facilities are of such design, location and purpose that it will produce minimal adverse effects; and (4) issue the appropriate amended corridor certificates and amended route permits.

The proposed route for the pipelines is shown on the attached map.

On March 26, 2008 the Commission issued a Notice of Filing and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing providing until May 6, 2008 for interested parties to comment or request a hearing.

On May 6, 2008 John Sandberg, a resident of Penn, North Dakota requested a Hearing concerning the Penn Station and upgrades.

A public hearing on the application is scheduled to begin **Friday, June 20, 2008 at 11:00 a.m. at the Ramsey County Courthouse, 524 4th Ave NE, Devils Lake, North Dakota.**

The issues to be considered at the hearing are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed pipeline facility at Penn produce minimal adverse effects on

the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?

2. Is the proposed pipeline facility at Penn compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed pipeline facility location at Penn minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
4. Is the proposed pipeline facility at Penn of such design, location, or purpose that it will produce minimal adverse effects so that procedures and time schedules may be waived?
5. Does a demonstrable emergency exist, which requires immediate construction so that adherence to procedures and time schedules would jeopardize the utility's system?
6. Is it appropriate for the Commission to waive any procedures and time schedules as requested in the application?
