U-Mary wasn't the favorite going into the season, and the 400 relay team was its only winner, but the Marauders found a way to get the job done.

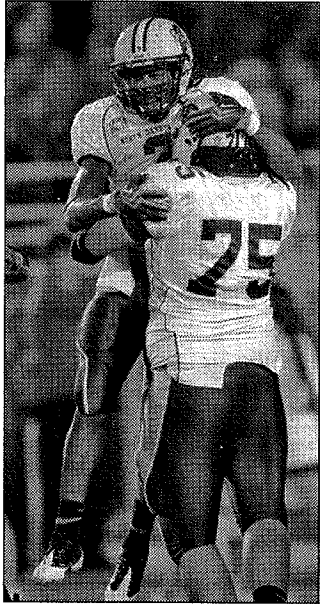
"Having our people to perform to that level to capture the team championship was very gratifying," Thorson said.

Other award winners:

■ Paschall, a senior running back, became the first NDSU player to earn Division I FCS first-team All-American honors (Associated Press, AFCA Coaches and Sports Network). Paschall finished first among all FCS players in rushing (139.7 per game) and was fifth in scoring (9.6 ppg) and ninth in all-purpose yardage (158.3). He participated in the East-West Shrine Bowl and was signed by the New England Patriots.

■ NDSU's Carlson earned All-American honors after placing 11th in the long jump at the NCAA Division I national championships with a leap of 20-3¾. Carlson also qualified for the national meet in the heptathlon, though she did not complete the event. The junior from Buchanan won three events (long jump, 100 hurdles and 400 hurdles) to lead the Bison to the Summit League conference championship.

■ Dickinson State's men's track team took second at the NIAA outdoor meet, the eighth year in a row the Blue Hawks have finished in the top two. Allan Ayala won his third straight national title in the 400-meter intermediate

hurdles, and Sean Piackstock won the 400. Dickinson also took second in the 400 relay and fourth in the 1,600 relay.

■ Berg led Williston State's men's basketball team to the Mon-Dak regular-season and tournament titles and the Region 13 championship. With former Bismarck High star Luke Martinez earning second-team All-American honors, the Tetons went 25-7, including a school-record 17-game winning streak.

■ Minot State softball went 34-14, winning the DAC tournament title and advancing to the NAIA tournament for the first time. The Beavers went 2-1 at nationals, but lost a tiebreaker to eventual runner-up Oklahoma City. Shortstop Janessa Penner was an honorable mention All-American.

he doesn't just play for exercise. He's well aware someone is keeping score.

"We've brought a lot of trophies home. We've never won McQuade but we've gotten a lot of seconds, thirds and fourths. We've gotten three or four seconds, but we can't get the big one," Anderson said.

Marv's has played for a Masters 35 championship each of the last three seasons. Mandan Shirt Shack won last summer, Grand Forks Rumors-Miller Lite prevailed in 2008 and Bismarck Stadium Sports Bar won the 2007 title.

There are other big ones that haven't eluded Marv's.

"The last time we counted all the trophies down at Marv's, it was over 175 of them from 26 years. He's got a pile of them," Anderson said. "... We've won four state tournaments — the 30-and-over, the 35-and-over twice and last year we won the 40-and-over."

Anderson said he like to snap the McQuade jinx and garner a championship. Failing that, he wants to add to

his sponsor's trophy collection.

"We always want to win, but we also go there to have a good time. Everyone enjoys the McQuade, I guess," he said.

There was a time when the McQuade was one of many tournaments Marv's packed into a season. Anderson said his team has cut back on the pace markedly in recent years.

"Our first few years we went to a tournament just about every weekend," he said. "... Now we just play our league tournament and McQuade and go to state."

Anderson has been a McQuade regular. He played in eight of the nine McQuade tournaments before forming the Marv's Bar team and hasn't missed since.

"We were the Merchants for awhile and a couple of other bars had us (as sponsors)," Anderson said. "I've never missed since we started Marv's. I think I've only missed one total. ... I'm the old guy on the team. We're trying to keep the younger ones going."
