

SCHOOL: Fresh Fruit and Vegetable program expanded

Convention, which was held last month in Indianapolis, Ind.

"The students and Mr. Brown represented our school in a great way," En-

gelhart said.

"I was very impressed with the convention and the professionalism of it. I believe FFA is a great program for our students."

Engelhart added that she can see how FFA and other extracurricular activities,

such as the play and the speech program can complement each other.

"There was a lot of public speaking during the convention," she said. "The students — both ours and others from all over the country — come off as very polished in those kinds of situations."

Elementary principal Shawn Kuntz told the board it's likely that the school will expand its participation in the federal Fresh Fruit and Vegetables Program to five days per week.

The program is administered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the North Dakota Department of Public Instruction.

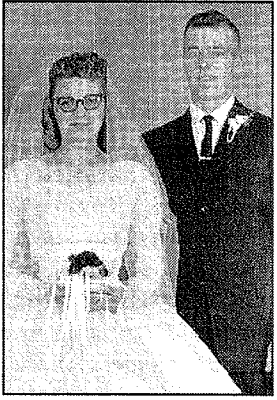
"A survey has indicated in favor of expanding the program and eliminating the brought-from-home snacks," Kuntz said.

Although states can and do limit the items their schools can order, the USDA website indicates there are dozens of products available

through the program, including lettuce, salad mix, white mushrooms, broccoli, alfalfa sprouts, watermelon, apples, oranges, lemons, honeydew, nectarines, kiwi fruit, strawberries, pineapples, pears, celery sticks, kale, cantaloupe, red grapes, collard greens, cucumbers, carrots, avocado, tomatoes, peaches, spinach, radishes and bananas.

In conjunction with expanding the program, Kuntz said students will be asked about the fruits and vegetables served so far and the least-liked will be removed from the rotation.

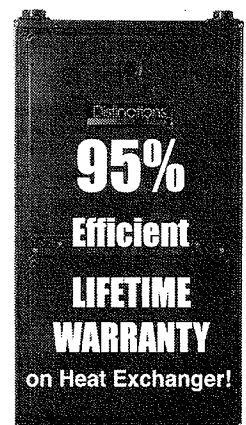

On October 6, 2010, enXco Development Corporation filed an application for a certificate of site compatibility to authorize construction of a 150 MW Merricourt Wind Power Project consisting of up to 100 wind turbine

generators and associated facilities in Dickey and McIntosh Counties of North Dakota as shown on the attached map.

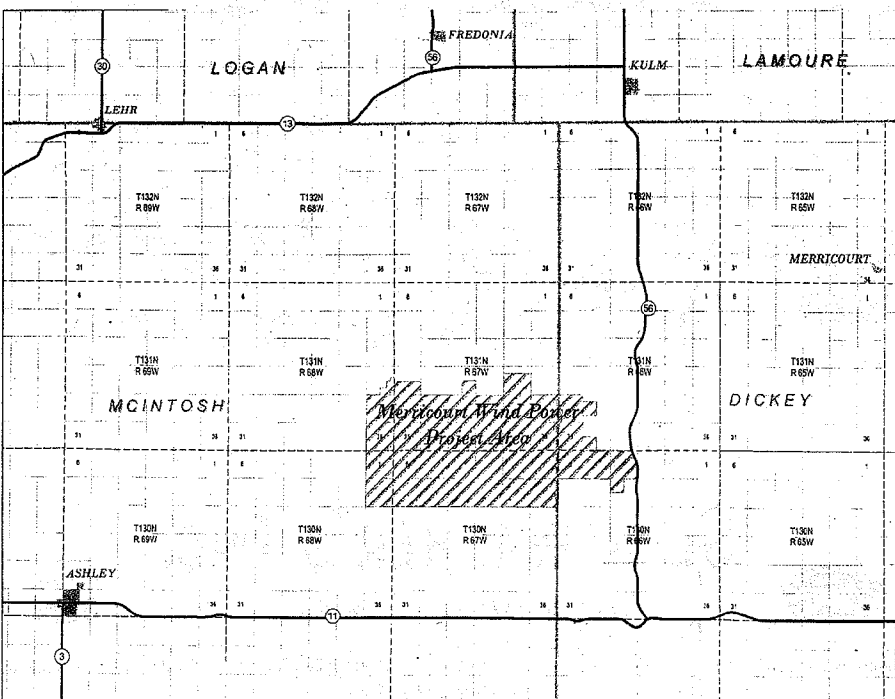
A Public Hearing on the application is scheduled to begin on December 21, 2010 at 10:00 a.m. CST at Teddy's Grill, 1101 Industrial Park, Edgeley, ND 58433. The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse

human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
