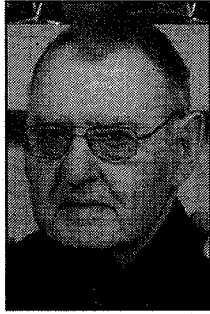


Obituaries

Joseph Holzer, son of Rochus and Barbara (Schneider) Holzer was born Feb. 19, 1913 at Strasburg, where he grew up and attended school. Joe worked for CC Corps in 1934, WPA/APX from 1936-37 and Logan County for 17 years, hauling gravel.

Restitution made for vandalism

Golf course needed \$4,400 in repairs following incident

Restitution has been made in connection with a vandalism incident last fall that caused damage to trees and greens at Lloyd E. Rigler Golf Course, west of Wishek.

Jerome Goebel, of Wishek, was not charged, but he has paid nearly \$4,400 to the Wishek Park Board, which oversees operations at the golf course, to cover costs associated with the vandalism, according to McIntosh County Chief Deputy Sheriff Gerard Zlotkowski.

Goebel, 30, was interviewed by the Sheriff's Department following the Oct. 4 incident. He admitted involvement and agreed to pay for the damage. Park Board members preferred timely restitution over asking law enforcement and the state's attorney to pursue criminal

charges, Zlotkowski said.

According to an incident report prepared for the Park Board by Zlotkowski, an investigation revealed a dual-wheel pickup truck or similar vehicle was driven on the golf course. Tire tread marks were found on the fifth-hole green and the pin flag on that hole was damaged.

"Other areas of the course were damaged and there were visible tire marks, with

the same tread in virtually every area of the course," the report says. "There were several trees that were driven over and one large spruce tree in the (fifth) fairway that was completely run over and destroyed. It was broken off at the base of the tree and lying on it's (sic) side facing a west direction.

"One tee-off area had the sand bucket and other assorted materials damaged beyond repair. Additionally,

there was evidence of general damage across other greens and the tire treads matched on each of these areas."

Goebel told Zlotkowski another man was in the vehicle with him during the incident, but Goebel took full responsibility for it.

"He said it was too much hell-raising and doing stupid things," the deputy wrote in his report to the Park Board.

in Dickey and McIntosh Counties of North Dakota as shown on the attached map.

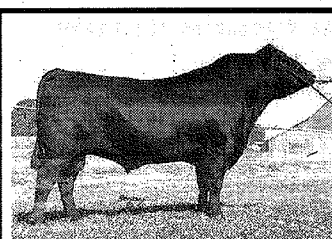
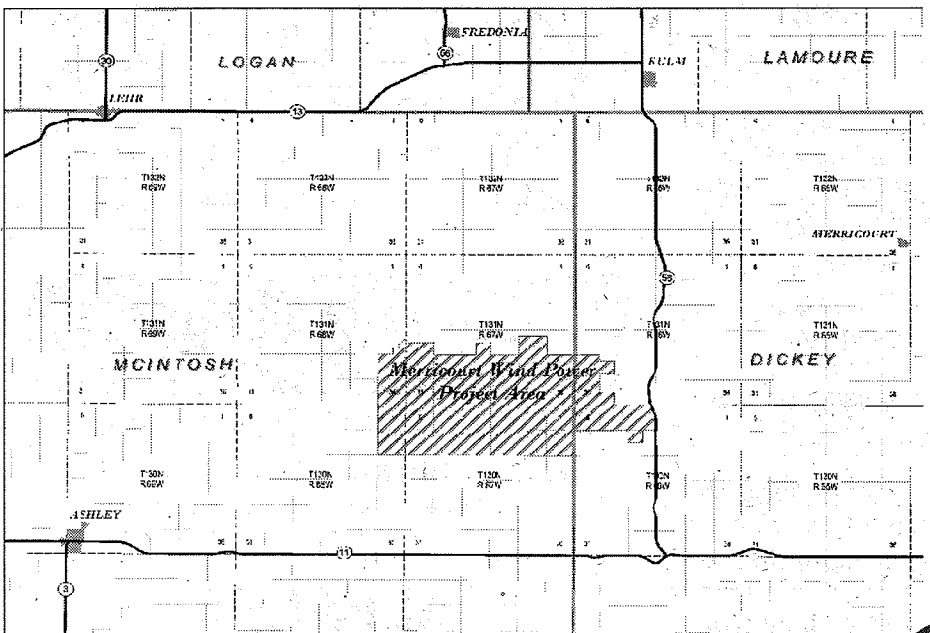
A Public Hearing on the application is scheduled to begin on April 15, 2011 at 10:00 a.m. CDT at the Dickey County Courthouse, 309 2nd St, Ellendale, ND 58436. The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impacts

while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
