AUG. 18, 1960

• Douglas Weber, son of the Reinie Webers, attended the annual Black Hills Motorcycle Classic and Gypsy Tour in Sturgis, SD from August 11-14. Approximately 900 cyclists took part in the classics which included races, climbs, etc.

• Rain, measuring .38 at Ashley early Wednesday morning halted combining operations in parts of this area where the moisture fell. Much of the wheat crop has been combined, having passed the half-way mark. One local buyer estimated that up to 80 percent of the wheat has been harvested. The yield is expected to average somewhere between 15 to 20.

• Opening of schools in the Ashley school system has been set for Monday, September 5, according to Superintendent R.W. Goheen.

AUG. 21, 1980

• McIntosh County Auditor David Helmer announced that the deadline for filing for public office has passed. Helmer said people filing are: John Salzer, Jr. for Commissioner. Salzer is the incumbent. For Superintendent Incumbent, Sidney Gross filed as did Jerald G. Retzer. Filing for state offices in the 30th District were Incumbents, L.L. Pete Naaden, for State Senator and William E. Kretschmar for State Representative. Wilber Vander Vorst and Al Kramer also filed for State Representative.

• The McIntosh County Hospital Auxiliary has spent much time and effort working to help the hospital and a cording to Sonja Schnabel, Auxiliary Pres., the Auxiliary has donated about \$12,000.00 to the hospital in the last two years.

• Kirk Walker, the new owner of Sportsmen's Bar, patched a spot before primer was applied to the Main Street Bar. The name will be changed to Kirk's Detour. The building will be painted orange and wheat colors.

• On July 29, fire destroyed the historic Blue Room in Strasburg. The next two buildings in the block were saved.

All bids are to be submitted on the basis of cash payment for the work and materials, and each bid shall be accompanied by a separate envelope containing the contractor's license and bid security. The bid security must be in a sum equal to five per cent (5%) of the full amount of the bid and must be in the form of a bidder's bond. A bidder's bond must be executed by the bidder as principal and by a surety company authorized to do business in this state, conditioned that if the principal's bid is accepted and the contract awarded to the principal, the principal, within ten (10) days after notice of award, will execute and effect a contract in accordance with the terms of his bid and the bid bond as required by the laws of the State of North Dakota and the regulations and determinations of the governing body. If a successful bidder does not execute a contract within (10) days allowed, the bidder's bond must be forfeited to the governing body and the project awarded to the next lowest responsible bidder.

All bidders, except a bidder on a municipal, rural, and industrial water supply project using funds provided under Public Law No. 99-294 [100 Stat. 426, 43 U.S.C. 390a], must be licensed for the full amount of the bid as required by Section 43-07-05 and 43-07-12 of the North Dakota Century Code. For projects using funds provided under Public Law No. 99-294 [100 Stat. 426, 43, U.S.C. 390a],

the Bidder shall obtain a contractor's license for the full amount of its Bid within twenty days after it is determined the Bidder is the lowest responsible Bidder. Should the Bidder fail to obtain the license within the specified period the Bid will be rejected and awarded to the next lowest responsible Bidder. The successful Bidder will be required to furnish Contract Performance and Payment Bonds in the full amount of the contract.

Contracts shall be awarded on the basis of the low bid submitted by a responsible and responsive bidder for the aggregate sum of all bid items. A single contract will be awarded for the work.

All bids will be contained in a sealed envelope, as above provided; plainly marked showing that such envelope contains a bid for the above project. In addition, the bidder shall place upon the exterior of such envelope the following information:

1. The work covered by the bidder
2. The name of the bidder
3. Separate envelope containing bid bond and a copy of Contractor's License or certificate of renewal.
4. Acknowledgement of the Addenda.

No Bid will be read or considered which does not fully comply with the above provisions as to Bond and licenses and any deficient Bid submitted will be resealed and returned to the Bidder immediately.

The work on the improvement will be completed by October 30, 2010, no later than 90 calendar days after Notice to Proceed.

The owner reserves the right to reject any and all bids, to waive any informality in any bid, to hold all bids for a period not to exceed 30 days from the date of opening bids, and to accept the bid deemed most favorable to the interest of the

Owner.

Should the Contractor fail to complete the work within the time required herein or within such extra time as may have been granted by formal extension of time approved by the Owner, there will be deducted from any amount due the Contractor the sum of \$500 per day and every day that the completion of the work is delayed. Notice of water quality

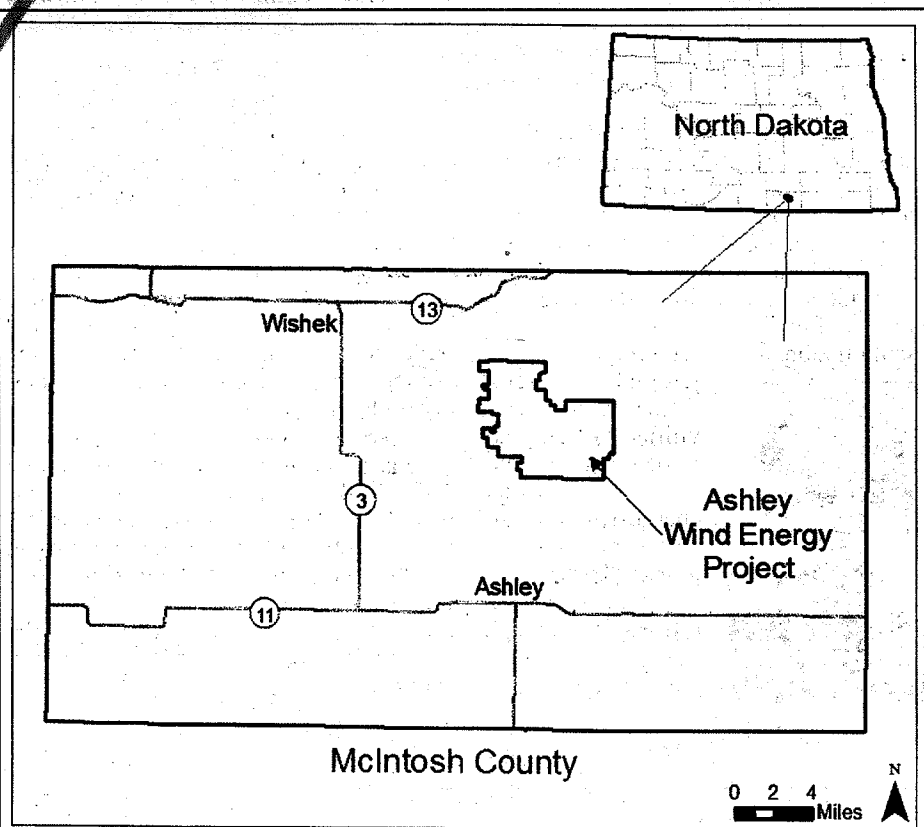
PUBLIC NOTICE STATEMENT

Notice of submittal to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and a request for public comment on the State of North Dakota's Beaver Creek and Tributaries Fecal Coliform Bacteria Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) report.

1. Summary Section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act (CWA) and its accompanying regulations (CFR Part 130 Section 7) requires each state to identify waterbodies (i.e., lakes, reservoirs, rivers, streams, and wetlands) which are considered water quality limited and require load allocations, waste load allocations, or total maximum daily loads. A waterbody is considered water quality limited when it is known that its water quality does not meet applicable water quality standards or is not expected to meet applicable water quality standards. Waterbodies can be water quality limited due to point sources of pollution, non-point sources of pollution, or both. Section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act requires states to develop Total Maximum Daily Loads for waterbodies that are water quality limited and listed on the state's Section 303(d) list. This list has become known as the "TMDL list" or "Section 303(d) list."

Following an opportunity for public comment, the state must submit TMDLs to the EPA Regional Administrator. The EPA Regional Administrator then has 30 days to either approve or disapprove the TMDL. The purpose of this notice is to solicit public comment prior to formally submitting the Beaver Creek and Tributaries Fecal Coliform Bacteria TMDL report to the EPA Regional Administrator.

2. Public Comments Persons wishing to comment on the Beaver Creek Fecal Coliform Bacteria TMDL report may do so, in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of this public notice. Comments must be received within this 30-day period to ensure consideration in the EPA approval or disapproval decision. All comments should include the name, address, and telephone number of the person submitting comments, and a statement of the relevant facts upon which they are based. All comments should be submitted to the attention of the Section 303(d) TMDL Coordinator, North Dakota Department of Health, Division of Water Quality, Gold Seal Center, 918 East Divide Avenue, 4th Floor, Bismarck, ND 58501-1947. The Beaver Creek Fecal Coliform Bacteria TMDL report may be reviewed at the North Dakota Department of Health's office in Bismarck, ND. A copy of the TMDL can be obtained or reviewed during normal business hours or by accessing it through the Department's web address (<http://www.ndhealth.gov>). On May 14, 2010, CPV Ashley Renewable Energy Company, LLC filed an application for a certificate of site compatibility to authorize construction of its Ashley Wind Energy Project consisting of up to 87 wind turbine generators totaling up to approximately 200.1 MW of generating capacity and

associated facilities in McIntosh County, North Dakota as shown on the attached map.

A Public Hearing on the application is scheduled to begin on August 23, 2010 at 11 a.m. CDT in the McIntosh County Court House, 112 1st St NE, Ashley, ND 58413. The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse

human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
