Brown missed both bonus free throw attempts and a fumble of the rebound put the ball temporarily in Miner hands until the pass up court went out of bounds. The Troopers were able to use the Christmas break to try to improve on a few things defensively

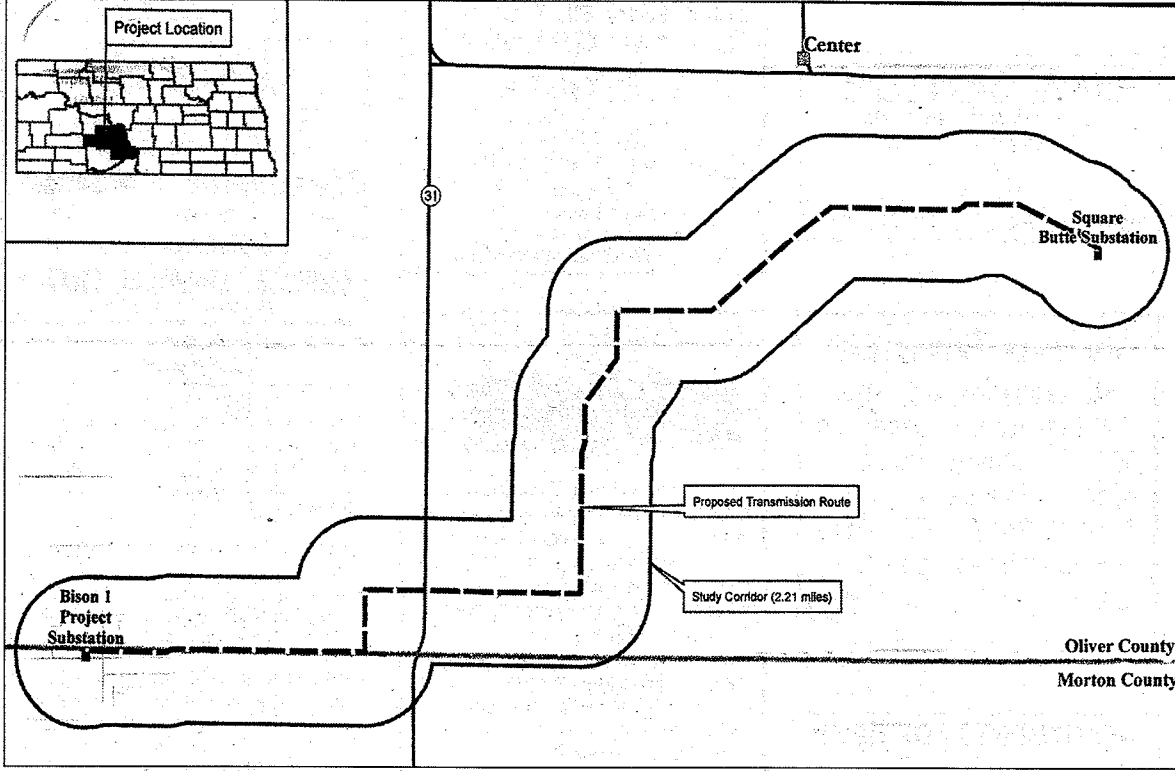
and to work on some things that may help the team be more productive offensively.

NOTICE OF FILING AND NOTICE OF HEARING

On October 6, 2009 and on December 14, 2009, Minnesota Power, an operating division of Allele, Inc., (Allele) filed an application for a waiver of procedures and time schedules, a corridor certificate and a route permit to authorize construction of 22.1 miles of 230 kV electric transmission line and associated facilities in Morton and Oliver Counties of North Dakota, as shown on the attached map. Minnesota Power requests the Commission waive procedures and time schedules set forth in North Dakota Century Code chapter 49-22 and North Dakota

Administrative Code article 69-06 to allow for a single consolidated application for corridor certificate and route permit and to hold a combined hearing on the waiver request and application for corridor certificate and route permit.

A Public Hearing on the application is scheduled to begin February 1, 2010, at 10:00 a.m. CST, at the Oliver County Court House, 115 Main Street, Center, North Dakota 59503. The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integ-

ity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

4. Is it appropriate for the Commission to waive procedures and time schedules as requested, including the request for a single consolidated application for corridor certificate and route permit?

The application is for a high voltage direct current (HVDC) conversion facility currently permitted by Minnkota Power Cooperative. The applicant will be the new operator of the facility. The discharges include once-through cooling water from the facility, blowdown from a strainer on the intake supply line and the outlet for floor drains located in the HVDC building. Once this permit is finalized the discharges will be removed from Minnkota's permit. The facility is located in the SE 1/4 section 33, T142N, R83W. All discharges are to Nelson Lake which is classified as a class 3 lake.

Tentative Determinations
Proposed effluent limitations and other permit conditions have been made by the Department. They assure that State Water Quality Standards and ap-

licable provisions of the FWPCA will be protected.

Information Requests and Public Comments

All comments received by January 31, 2010 will be considered prior to finalizing the permit. If there is significant interest, a public hearing will be scheduled.
