The North Dakota Department of Health
(NDDH) has conducted a review of the
proposed gravity wastewater transfer line
improvement project for the City of Dickin-
son in accordance with the National Envi-
ronmental Policy Act (40 CFR Part 6).
The NDDH has determined that this project
is eligible for a Categorical Exclusion and
is exempt from further substantive
environmental review.
Because the proposed project meets the
criteria for a categorical exclusion, a full
Finding of No Significant Impact and Envi-
ronmental Assessment will not be re-
quired. Following is a description of the
proposed project and a brief statement of
how the project meets the criteria for a
categorical exclusion.

The proposed project consists of installing
a 30-inch diameter gravity wastewater
transfer line between two existing waste-
water stabilization pond cells. The exist-
ing transfer line does not provide ade-
quate flow to transfer wastewater effi-
ciently and thus impedes the treatment
process. The least costly and most envi-
ronmentally sound alternative is to con-
struct a 30-inch diameter gravity pipeline
to transfer wastewater between the cells,
providing more time for isolation and
retention.
The Dickinson wastewater system will
have adequate capacity to serve the
users in the city. The new transfer line will
assure that the wastewater treatment sys-
tem will function effectively.

The City of Dickinson will apply for a
Clean Water State Revolving Fund loan
of \$800,000.00 to finance the project.
The City has the legal authority and finan-
cial and administrative capability to con-
struct the proposed improvements.

This project is being granted an exclusion
because construction of the gravity trans-
fer line will occur in previously disturbed
areas between the existing wastewater
stabilization ponds along the Heart River.
No previously undisturbed areas will be
affected by the construction activities.

The project has been given a permit by
the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for a
surface crossing of the Heart River under
Section 404 of the Clean Water Act.
The North Dakota Department of Health
certifies under Section 401 of the Clean
Water Act that the project will not violate
applicable water quality standards.
The North Dakota State Historic Preser-
vation Officer has concluded that no His-
toric Properties will be affected. It has
been determined that exempting the pro-
posed project from further review under
the National Environmental Policy Act will
not result in adverse impacts to the popu-
lation or area of Stark County.
The documentation to support this deci-
sion will be on file and available for public
review at the NDDH, Division of Municipal
Facilities.
