Pavlik scraps title bout with Williams

Middleweight champion Kelly Pavlik called off a title defense against Paul Williams set for Dec. 5 because of an infected hand.

Pavlik was scheduled to fight Williams at Atlantic City's Boardwalk Hall in one of the year's most anticipated bouts, but promoter Top Rank announced Wednesday that Pavlik is unable to make a fist or punch with the injured left hand.

Top Rank president Todd duBoef said Pavlik's recovery has "not progressed as projected by Dr. Peter Evans at the Cleveland Clinic. Once Pavlik is cleared medically by

Dr. Evans, we will pursue all avenues with regards to a future bout."

Pavlik and Williams were supposed to fight in October, but the bout was postponed at the last minute because of the hand injury. The decision came while promoters and sponsors were already traveling to New York for the announcement.

The news conference finally was held two weeks ago at Giants Stadium. Pavlik said at the time his hand was feeling better after a second surgery removed most of the infection. He was beginning to run and planned to start training in earnest this week.

When he showed up at the gym this week, trainer

Jack Loew realized that Pavlik wasn't able to spar or hit a punching bag with his left hand. Loew finally suggested the fight be called off, and it's unclear when the WBC and WBO titleholder will finally make it back in the ring.

Pavlik (35-1, 31 KOs) believes the infection could date to last October, when he was pounded by Bernard Hopkins in a bout at 170 pounds. Pavlik returned in February to stop Marco Antonio Rubio in a title defense before a hometown crowd in Youngstown, Ohio, but hasn't fought since.

Top Rank blamed the hand injury for the postponement and cancellation

NOTICE OF ORDER OF REPRIMAND OF ATTORNEY

In August 2009, a Petition for Discipline was filed against North Dakota Attorney Carey A. Goetz. The Petition contained allegations of misconduct resulting from Goetz's move from one law firm to another, specifically, Goetz's failure to inform her client and law firm of her plans to change law firms. Beginning in October 2007, Goetz represented a client in connection with a dispute that arose over a third party's mistake in disbursing funds that were the subject of a Qualified Domestic Relations Order. The parties agreed to settle their dispute and began the process of drafting and circulating settlement documents, but before all requirements of the settlement were completed, Goetz negotiated future employment with a law firm whose partner was the attorney for the opposing party in the client's pending litigation. Goetz accepted a position with the other law firm on September 17, 2008, and commenced employment with the other firm on November 24, 2008, at which time Goetz was under the impression she had completed all of the work for which the client had retained her. Goetz did not, at any time prior to leaving her former firm to begin work at the other firm, advise her client of her plans to change law firms. Goetz did not contest the material facts of the Petition but cited mitigating factors, including the absence of a prior disciplinary history, the absence of purposeful intent or a dishonest or selfish motive and inexperience in the practice of law. Goetz and Disciplinary Counsel entered into a Stipulation and Consent to Discipline which was accepted by a Hearing Panel of the Disciplinary Board of the Supreme Court. As a result, the Hearing Panel issued

its Order of Reprimand, reprimanding Goetz for violations of Rules 1.4(b) (communication) and 1.7(c) (conflict of interest) of the North Dakota Rules of Professional Conduct. The Hearing Panel also assessed costs against Goetz in the sum of \$250.

Rule 1.4(b) provides that a lawyer shall explain a matter to the extent reasonably necessary to permit the client to make informed decisions regarding the representation. Because the client had the ultimate right to select counsel of his choice, information that Goetz was planning to change law firms was reasonably necessary to permit the client to make an informed decision whether Goetz should continue to represent him, whether the matter should be completed by another lawyer from Goetz's former firm, or whether the matter should be transferred elsewhere.

Rule 1.7(c) provides that a lawyer shall not represent a client if the representation of that client might be adversely affected by the lawyer's own interests, unless the lawyer reasonably believes the representation will not be adversely affected and the client consents after consultation; in that Goetz neither consulted with her client nor secured the client's consent to her continued representation after Goetz's negotiations with the other law firm created the situation where the representation might be adversely affected.
