1/4 teaspoon ground all-
spice
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon ground black
pepper
Four 6-ounce bone-in or
boneless pork chops
1/2 cup white wine
1 cup chicken broth
1/2 cup orange juice
1 tablespoon cornstarch

Salt and ground black
pepper, to taste
Heat the oven to 375 F.
In a small bowl, combine
the orange zest and juice, the
pistachios, goat cheese, all-
spice, salt and pepper.
Arrange the pork chops in
a metal roasting pan. Spread
a quarter of the pistachio
mixture over the top of each

chop. Roast for 20 to 25 min-
utes, or until the chops reach
155 F at the thickest part.
Transfer the pork chops to a
plate. Cover with foil to keep
warm while preparing the
sauce.
Place the pan on the
stove top over medium heat.
Add the wine and scrape the
bottom of the pan to loosen

any browned bits. Add the
chicken broth and bring to a
simmer. In a small glass, mix
the orange juice and the
cornstarch, then add to the
pan, stirring until thickened.
Strain the sauce through a
mesh strainer, if desired.
Adjust the seasoning with
salt and black pepper. Serve
sauce with the pork chops.

On February 18, 2011, Minnkota Power
Cooperative, Inc. (Minnkota) filed an
application for a Certificate of Site
Compatibility for Transmission Facility
Corridor for approximately 260 miles of
345 kV transmission line and associated
facilities to be constructed from the Center
Substation near Center, North Dakota to
the Prairie Substation near Grand Forks,
North Dakota, as shown on the attached
map. Minnkota requests the Commission
approve a 1,000 foot-wide corridor under
N.D. Admin. Code section 69-06-04-02(b).
If a corridor certificate is granted then a
separate route permit application and
hearing is required before designating a

transmission line route within the approved
corridor.
On March 24, 2011 the Commission issued
a Notice of Filing and Notice of Hearing,
scheduling three separate public hearings
for May 3, 4, and 13, 2011. The Commission
has since received several requests to
postpone the hearings until after the
spring planting season. Therefore, please
take notice that Public Hearings on the
application are rescheduled to be held:

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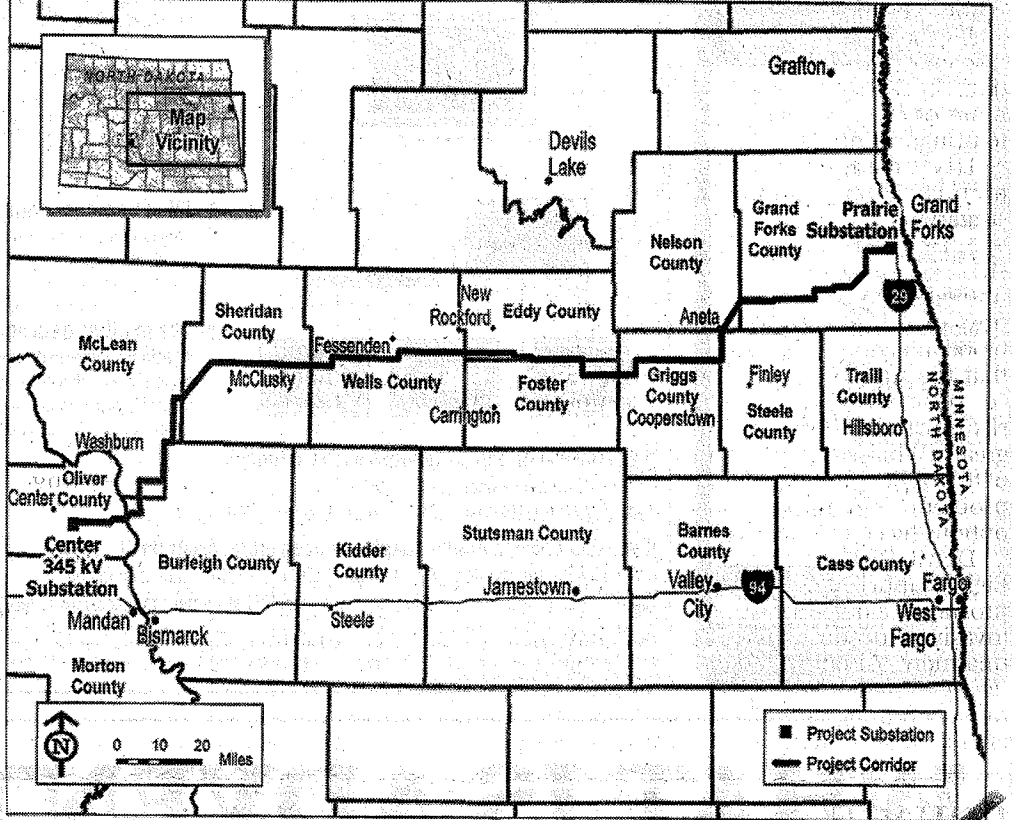
