Underwood School minutes

March 24, 2011

The Underwood Board of Education of the Underwood School District #8 met March 24, 2011, for their regular monthly meeting in the conference room at 5:30 p.m.

Directors present: Eichhorst, Heger, Landenberger, Leidholm, LeRoy, and Trautman

Directors absent: Seidler

Others present: Superintendent Ekstrom, Principal Robinson, and Principal Weisgarber

Guests: Toni Cottingham and Dawnae Lee

President Leidholm called the meeting to order.

There were no additions to the agenda.

LeRoy moved to approve the February 22, 2011, board meeting minutes, March 9, 2011, special meeting minutes, and March 14, 2011, special meeting minutes. Trautman second, motion carried.

Landenberger moved to authorize payment of the March bills, Eichhorst second, motion carried.

Trautman moved to approve the February expenditure reports as presented: General Fund Expenses \$30,562.42 (Vendor Ck# 22523-22564); Payroll \$139,158.67 (Payroll Ck#1018244-1018255, Direct Deposit# 2259-2348); Activity Fund Expenses \$14,075.29 (Vendor Ck# 6340-6392); and Hot Lunch Expenses \$11,252.34 (Payroll & Vendor Ck# 2849-2862, Direct Deposit# 151-159); Eichhorst second, motion carried.

No committee reports were given.

Personnel Chair Landenberger commented that things are looking positive on the offer made to Brandt Dick and the committee will schedule a meeting with him to finalize terms.

Under unfinished business, the board discussed the invoices submitted by Dan Johannes for tractor damage

the board that the business manager did submit a claim with the school's liability insurance carrier but it was denied because the school district was not negligent. The board discussed the incident, the issue of blocked roads, and whether or not the school should be attempting to get through those roads to pick up students. After much discussion, Landenberger moved to not pay the tractor repair bills submitted by Dan Johannes, LeRoy second, roll vote taken, Eichhorst nay, Heger aye, Landenberger aye, LeRoy aye, Trautman aye, Leidholm aye, motion carried.

Under new business, Eichhorst moved to accept the UEA as the exclusive bargaining unit for upcoming negotiations, Landenberger second, motion carried.

The board briefly discussed doing the school census, which is normally done every two years. Principal Robinson commented that the information she gets when registering new preschool students is sufficient for her planning purposes. The board concluded that it would not be necessary to do the census.

LeRoy moved to accept the open enrollment from Curt and Karen Adolf, Trautman second, motion carried.

Supt. Ekstrom briefly discussed the Asbestos Abatement Proposal that was in the board packet. He told the board that we had received a proposal for \$12,340 to remove the remaining asbestos that still exists in the high school boiler room. Supt. Ekstrom told the board that removal would only be necessary if a proposal for boiler replacement is part of the improvements recommended by ESG.

The board would like to commend all the students on their recent accomplishments in both academics and athletics.

The next board meeting is scheduled for April 20, 2011, at 5:00 p.m.

On February 18, 2011, Minnkota Power Cooperative, Inc. (Minnkota) filed an application for a Certificate of Site Compatibility for Transmission Facility Corridor for approximately 260 miles of 345 kV transmission line and associated facilities to be constructed from the Center Substation near Center, North Dakota to the Prairie Substation near Grand Forks, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map. Minnkota requests the Commission approve a 1,000 foot-wide corridor under N.D. Admin. Code section 69-06-04-02(b). If a corridor certificate is granted then a separate route permit application and hearing is required before designating a transmission line route within the approved corridor.

On March 24, 2011 the Commission issued a Notice of Filing and Notice of Hearing, scheduling three separate public hearings for May 3, 4, and 13, 2011. The Commission has since received several requests to postpone the hearings until after the spring planting season. Therefore, please take notice that Public Hearings on the application are rescheduled to be held:

June 16, 2011, 10:00 a.m. at the Northwood High School, 300 35th St. NE, Northwood, ND 58267.

June 17, 2011, 10:00 a.m. at the Chieftain Conference Center, Teepee Room, 60 4th Ave. S, Carrington, ND 58204.

June 24, 2011, 10:00 a.m. at Memorial Hall, 805 Main Ave., Washburn, ND 58577.

The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?

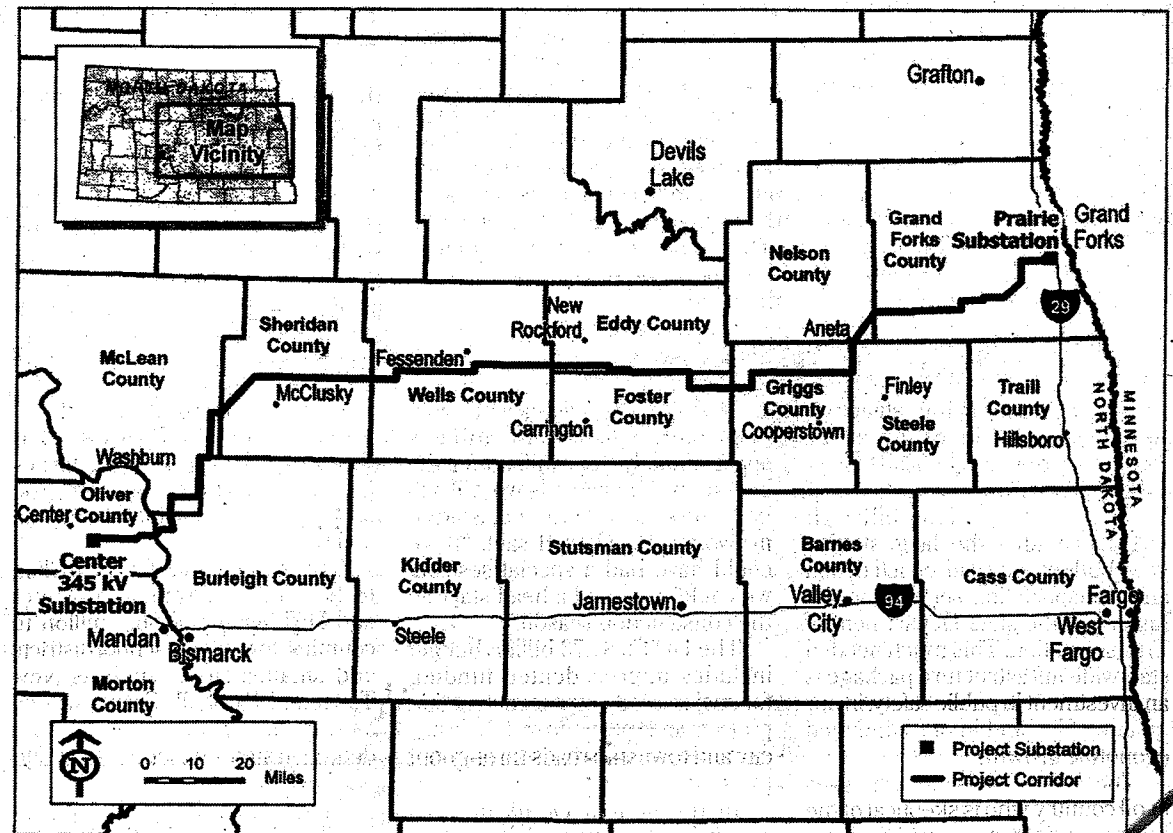
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?

3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

4. Is it appropriate for the Commission to approve a 1,000 foot-wide corridor as requested in the application?
