NOTICE OF RESCHEDULED HEARINGS
April 20, 2011

On February 18, 2011, Minnkota Power Cooperative, Inc. (Minnkota) filed an application for a Certificate of Site Compatibility for Transmission Facility Corridor for approximately 200 miles of 345KV transmission line and associated facilities to be constructed from the Center Substation near Center, North Dakota to the Prairie Substation near Grand Forks, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map. Minnkota requests the Commission approve a 1,000 foot-wide corridor under N.D. Admin. Code section 69-06-04-02(b). If a corridor certificate is granted then a separate route permit application and hearing is required before designating a transmission line route within the approved corridor. On March

24, 2011 the Commission issued a Notice of Filing and Notice of Hearing, scheduling three separate public hearings for May 3, 4, and 13, 2011. The Commission has since received several requests to postpone the hearings until after the spring planting season. Therefore, please take notice that Public Hearings on the application are rescheduled to be held:

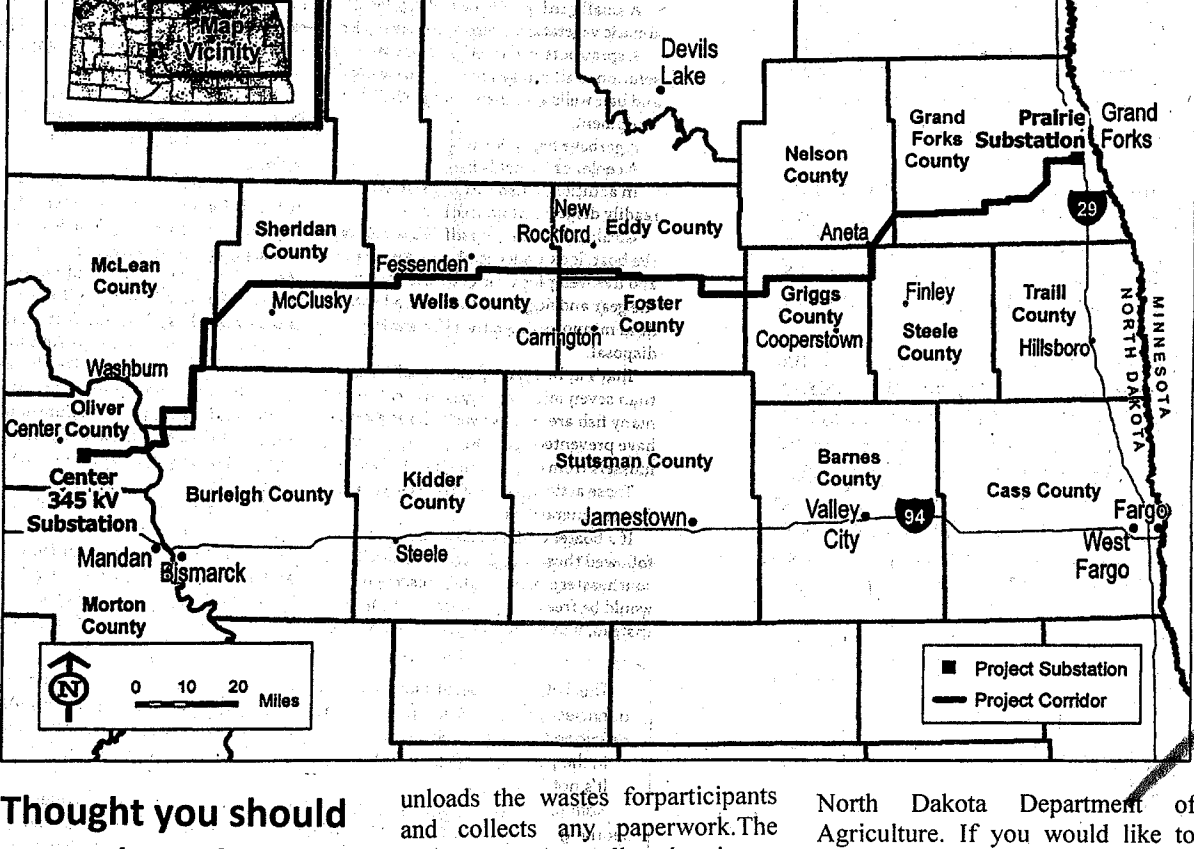

June 24, 2010, 10:00 a.m. at Memorial Hall, 805 Main Ave., Washburn, ND 58577.

The issues to be considered are:
1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?

- 2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
 - 3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
 - 4. Is it appropriate for the Commission to approve a 1,000 foot-wide corridor as requested in the application?

Project Safe Send Scheduled For July

The North Dakota Department of Agriculture is planning 12 Project Safe Send sites and is encouraging anyone with banned or unusable pesticides to schedule a trip to Project Safe Send this July.

This program is for everyone: farmers, ranchers, pesticide dealers and applicators, government agencies and homeowners. It's a safe, simple and nonregulatory program to help you safely and legally get rid of unusable pesticides free of charge.

The program accepts any pesticides (herbicides, insecticides, rodenticides and fungicides) that are old, unusable or banned.

Participants can bring their unusable pesticides to a scheduled collection site. They are asked to complete a voluntary survey and inventory form. A contractor

unloads the wastes for participants and collects any paperwork. The whole process usually takes just a few minutes. After the collections, pesticides are packed carefully and shipped out of state for incineration. People with more than 1,000 pounds of pesticides should preregister by contacting the North Dakota Department of Agriculture. No other preregistration is required.

A maximum of 20,000 pounds of pesticide per participant will be accepted. Pesticide rinse water also will be accepted at any of the 12 collection sites. The first 100 pounds of rinse water will be taken free of charge; a fee of \$1 per pound will be applied for each additional pound of rinse water.

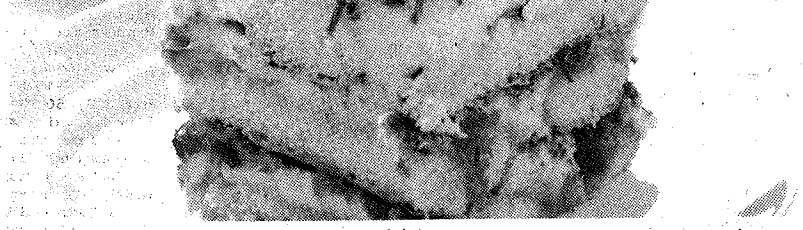
Check your storage areas for any unusable pesticides and set them aside for Project Safe Send. In the meantime, keep pesticides locked up safely. If you have deteriorating or leaking containers, pack them in larger containers and add absorbent materials. Free heavy-duty plastic bags are available from the

North Dakota Department of Agriculture. If you would like to preregister more than 1,000 pounds of pesticides, receive heavy-duty plastic bags or have questions about Project Safe Send, contact Jessica Johnson at the North Dakota Department of Agriculture at (800) 242-7535 or jjohnson@nd.gov. The schedule is tentative and will be finalized in May. Call the Department of Agriculture or go to its website, www.agdepartment.com, in late May for directions to the sites.

Lakota Municipal Utility Commission is accepting bids for Lakota, North Dakota, will be held prior to 2:00PM, CST, July 13, 2011, at the City Hall, 108 B Avenue East, Lakota, ND. All bids must be submitted by the Superintendent of Public Works and will be opened at 10:00 AM on July 13, 2011 at 7:00 PM. A prebid meeting will be held on July 13, 2011 at 1:00PM, CDT at the City Hall, 108 B Avenue East, Lakota, ND. The prebid meeting is to discuss the scope of the project and answer questions. Bidders may have a maximum of 15 minutes to ask questions. The meeting will cover construction schedules and project coordination. The project includes equipment to install overhead electrical distribution within the City of Lakota. Major functions to be performed are as follows:

- 1. 7,480 feet of boring and backfill.
- 2. Installing 24,984 of 1/2" copper wire in conduit.
- 3. Installation of 30 primary junction boxes and ground rods.

The Plans and Specifications are available at the City of Lakota, 108 B Avenue East, Room 248, upon payment of \$25.00, not refundable. Plans and Specifications may be obtained from the Office of the Owner or the Office of the Engineer.
