

Monday at the Maple River Indoor. Barnes County North finished third with 77.5 points, FSHP was fourth with 76 and Maple Valley-Enderlin scored 45 points to finish fifth.

SaraLi Petersen had a strong showing for BCN. Petersen won both the 55 hurdles and long jump, and added a second-place in triple jump and a third in the 55-meter dash. Sydney Reimers added a second-place finish in pole vault.

Shelby Krueger won two individual titles for FSHP, sprinting her way to victories in the 55 and 200 races.

Maple Valley had third-place finishes from Emily Cavett (200), Nikki Laufenberg (long jump, triple jump) and Kelsey Laufenberg (shot put). Kelsey Laufenberg's throw of 35 feet, 8 1/2 inches would have been a state-qualifying throw at an outdoor track meet.

NOTICE OF HEARING
March 24, 2010

On October 5, 2009, Otter Tail Power Company (Otter Tail) filed an application for advance determination of prudence of Otter Tail's participation and ownership in three high-voltage transmission line projects, Case No. PU-09-676:

- A 250-mile long, 345 kV transmission line between Fargo, North Dakota and the northwest quadrant of the Twin Cities, Minnesota.

- A 200-mile long, 345 kV transmission line between eastern South Dakota and the southeast quadrant of the Twin Cities in Minnesota.

- A 68-mile long, 230 kV transmission line between Bemidji, Minnesota and Grand Rapids, Minnesota.

On October 5, 2009, Northern States Power Company (NSP) filed an application for advance determination of prudence of NSP's participation and ownership in the same three high-voltage transmission line projects and, in addition, a 150-mile long, 345 kV transmission line between La Crosse, Wisconsin and the southeast Twin Cities, Minnesota area and two associated 161 kV lines in the Rochester, Minnesota area, Case No. PU-09-678.

Otter Tail and NSP are requesting that the Commission determine the construction of the transmission projects to be reasonable and prudent in order to provide the basis for future rate stability proposals the companies may present to the Commission.

Anyone wishing to become a party to this proceeding must file a Petition to Intervene by April 16, 2010. A consolidated public hearing on these two cases will be held beginning May 24, 2010 at 8:30 a.m. in the Commission Hearing Room, State Capitol, 12th Floor, Bismarck, North Dakota 58505. Issues to be considered in each case are:

1. Whether the resource addition is reasonable and prudent.
2. Whether the applicants have need for additional transmission resources.
3. What alternatives exist for meeting additional transmission needs.

Valley City Special Commission Proceedings

March 22, 2010

President Nielson presided and called the meeting to order with roll call. Members Present: Commissioners Evenson and Ondracek
Members Absent: Commissioners Wagar and Dutton

NEW BUSINESS

Discuss options on the 4th Avenue SW reconstruction project.

President Nielson opened the discussion stating that a suggestion had been made to initiate an additional .% sales tax for infrastructure on projects where state or federal reduce special assessments to property owners in those areas. Auditor Richter went over a spreadsheet that reflected the estimated costs per parcel using various scenarios, including applying money from a .% sales tax to the project.

Robert Drake suggested initiating a 1% sales tax for infrastructure instead of .%. Steve Urness suggested .% on the June ballot, and another .% later on. Attorney Fitzner stated that an item for the June ballot would have to be to the county auditor by April 5th, and if passed, would be effective July 1.

To reduce cost, other suggestions were ending the reconstruction of the street at Riverview Drive and 4th Avenue or on the hill (south end of 4th Ave) after the residences. If the paving project is protested out, the underground work could still be put in, or it could be put off for another year. Regardless if the project was done on

2010 or 2011, if the tax vote passed it could be used for either year.

FLOOD DISCUSSION

The water level is good right now, currently at 14'. Tuesday afternoon the National Weather Service will provide revised river forecasts.

At 5:12 pm Commissioner Evenson moved to adjourn the meeting.

EXCESS MILL LEVY NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on April 12, 2010 at the polling place of Arrowwood Prairie Coop in the Township of Uxbridge, County of Barnes, an election will be held in which the following question shall be submitted to the electors of Uxbridge Township:

Shall Uxbridge Township levy taxes for a five-year period commencing in 2010, which shall exceed the legal limit by \$11,261.00, so that the taxes levied, instead of being \$11,261.00, which is the limit authorized by law, shall be \$22,522.00.

BE IT KNOWN that the total income of Uxbridge Township from the first day of January, 2009, to the last day of December, 2009, was \$30,443 and that the total warrants issued for said period amounted to \$32,862, resulting in a deficit for said period of \$2,419.

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN that the expected expenditures for each year or a five-year period commencing in 2010 are roughly equivalent to \$35,000.00 spent in 2010.

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN that the current tax levy of 18 mills which produced \$11,261 in income in 2010 is the legal maximum, but that a 100 percent excess levy is authorized for a five-year period. If 60 percent of all votes cast upon the question are in favor of such excess levy, the levy shall be increased to be the amount of 36 mills upon each dollar of taxable valuation which increase would have produced \$11,261 in additional income at 2010 valuations.

Be it further known that said election will be opened at 3 o'clock p.m., and will continue open until 5 o'clock p.m. of said April 12, 2010.


