EVANSVILLE, Ind. (AP) — James Haarsma had 12 points and eight rebounds to help Evansville stun No. 25 Northern Iowa on Tuesday night.

Evansville had lost 17 of 18 before pulling off one of the biggest upsets of the college basketball season. It was the final home game of the season for the Purple Aces, and just 4,716 showed up to watch them beat a ranked team for the first time since 2003.

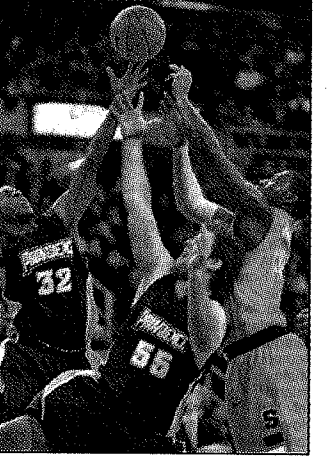
Kavon Lacey scored 11 points and Colt Ryan added 10 for Evansville (8-20, 2-15 Missouri Valley).

Suns 104, Thunder 102

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Jason Richardson connected on a floater from the foul line with 0.7 seconds left to complete the Suns' rally from a 10-point deficit and Phoenix snapped the Oklahoma City Thunder's nine-game winning streak with a victory.

Amare Stoudemire scored 30 points and Richardson had his first double-double of the season with 20 points and 13 rebounds for the Suns, who were down 10 with 3½ minutes to play.

Lakers 99, Grizzlies 98

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Kobe Bryant returned to the lineup after missing five games with an ankle injury and hit a 3-pointer with 4.3 seconds left to lift the Los Angeles Lakers to victory over the Memphis Grizzlies.

Bryant led the Lakers with 32 points, including his team's final nine points. His 3-pointer with 54 seconds left tied the game.

Pau Gasol added 22 points and 13 rebounds for the Lakers, who won for the seventh time in their last eight road games.

No. 4 Syracuse 99, Providence 85

Brooks and Peterson both scored 23 for Providence, which has lost seven straight.

No. 6 Kansas St. 83, Texas Tech 64

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) — Jacob Pullen scored 21 of his 28 points in the first half to lead No. 5 Kansas State to a victory over Texas Tech, the Wildcats' sixth straight win.

John Roberson scored 15 points for Texas Tech (16-11, 4-9), which lost its fourth straight, three of them to Top 25 teams in the past week.

No. 11 Georgetown 70, Louisville 60

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Austin Freeman scored 24 of his 29 points in the second half and No. 11 Georgetown bounced back from consecutive losses with a victory over Louisville.

The Hoyas (19-7, 9-6 Big East) trailed the entire first half but took control after that behind some sizzling shooting from Freeman and an extended scoring drought by the Cardinals (18-10, 9-6).

Notice of Intent to Reopen Proceeding February 19, 2010

On October 30, 2009, MHAND notified the Commission that, due to lack of economic support, it must relinquish its designation as the 211 dialing code user. On November 2, 2009, FirstLink notified the Commission that effective October 30, 2009, FirstLink will temporarily provide statewide 211 operations until a decision is made about 211's future. FirstLink subsequently indicated it would provide statewide 211 operations until March 15, 2010. On November 23, 2009, FirstLink filed a letter requesting designation as the statewide 211 dialing code user. On January 25, 2010, FirstLink notified the Commission that it was no longer interested in a statewide 211 designation due to a lack of stable long-term funding for the entire state. Therefore, FirstLink requested to be the designated user of the 211 dialing code in Cass County. On February 10, 2010, the Commission authorized FirstLink to use the 211 dialing code in Cass County, North Dakota for access to community information and referral services unless and until the Commission authorizes a different entity to use the 211 dialing code. On February 19, 2010, a meeting of stakeholders was held to assess support for statewide 211 services going forward. The Commission has reason to believe that
