



For Randy Travis, it's simple.

Wis. man pleads not guilty in friend's death

BALSAM LAKE, Wis. (AP)

— A northwestern Wisconsin man says he was defending himself when he killed his longtime friend.

Sixty-two-year-old Wayne Rouillard (ROO'-lee-ard) pleaded not guilty to first-degree intentional homicide in Polk County Circuit Court Tuesday.

A criminal complaint says Rouillard used a claw hammer, a knife and a wood-splitting maul to kill 61-year-old Stephen Dahlstrom Nov. 28. Police say Dahlstrom was found in a pool of blood in Rouillard's garage near Luck. His ankles were tied to a workbench and a knife was in his chest.

The St. Paul Pioneer Press reports Rouillard told police he and Dahlstrom were watching TV and drinking vodka when Dahlstrom "went berserk" and tried to stab him with an ice pick or screwdriver. Rouillard remains jailed in Polk County.

NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR COMMENT

December 10, 2009

On November 19, 2009, United Telephone Mutual Aid Corporation (United) entered into an interconnection agreement with Midcontinent Communications (Midcontinent) pursuant to Section 251 of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (Act). The agreement set forth terms and conditions under which United provides interconnection services, local number portability, ancillary services and wholesale services for resale to Midcontinent. The agreement was filed with the Commission on December 2, 2009.

On December 9, 2009, United filed a request for approval of the interconnection agreement in less than 90 days pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 252(e)(2)(A).

This agreement was filed under Section 252(e) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996. The Act requires that any agreement adopted by negotiation or arbitration be submitted for approval to the Commission. Under 47 U.S.C. § 252(e)(2)(A), the Commission may only reject an agreement adopted by negotiation (or a portion of the agreement) if it finds that:

1. the agreement discriminates against a telecommunications carrier that was not a party to the agreement; or

2. implementation of the agreement is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.

In addition, under 47 U.S.C. Section 253 the Commission may include, in its review, state requirements that do not constitute barriers to entry.

The Commission will receive written comments on this agreement until January 25, 2010.
