

# Mandan football

is playing its final regional game against Mandan. The Patriots close regular-season play with a home game against Fargo North.

Fourth-ranked Bismarck visits No. 5 Minot tonight and then hits the road to play last-place Williston in its regular season finale.

Minot closes the regular season by visiting Jamestown, which is winless in regional play.

Dickinson plays Fargo South in a nonregional game on Friday before closing at Mandan.

Both Janz and Zinke say the Braves could easily be 4-0 in regional play. Their first regional setback was a wild 41-40 loss at Minot. Mandan dropped a 54-33 shootout to Bismarck last week, paying the price for three turnovers.

Janz said those two games indicate Mandan can look any team squarely in the eye.

"It just says we can play with anybody, no matter how tough they are. It comes down to mistakes and making the big stops on defense," said Janz, a 6-foot-3, 194-pound junior.

Zinke said the Braves will be intimidated by no one. "If everyone does his job and everyone goes 100 percent on every play we can play with anyone in the West Region — anyone in the state," he said.

Indeed, Mandan's 4-3 record includes losses to three ranked teams — No. 2 Fargo South, No. 4 Bismarck and No. 5 Minot.

Janz, who leads the region by a wide margin in receiving yardage, and Zinke are vital elements in a Mandan offense that's second in the region in scoring offense and first in yardage offense. The Braves' attack also includes the leading rusher, Billy Binstock, and the No. 7 ground gainer, Seth Westby. Quarterback Devin Coyle tops the region in passing yardage and total offense.

Janz grabbed 10 passes for 255 yards and two touchdowns against Bismarck. He said the game was great fun, until the final verdict was rendered.

"It was a game you always dream about — playing with all that offense and with 7,200 people

there," Janz said. "It was a crazy game. Anyone who wanted to see offense got to see it."

Zinke agreed that most of last week's 48 minutes were a blast.

"It's fun when there's a shootout like that, going back and forth. But it's not fun to lose," he said.

On Thursday the Braves will play their offensive skills against a team noted for its defensive stinginess. Century ranks first in all the West Region's major defensive categories but pass defense. There the Patriots rank third.

Century has allowed just 117.4 yards per game on the ground. No regional foe has run for more than 127 yards against the Patriots.

"We're going to try some new things on offense this week which will help us to get past their tough defense," Janz said. "We have a lot of confidence that our offensive line can make holes for our backs."

Zinke, who is a two-year two-way starter, said the defense must play much better against Century.

"Our defense needs to step up and make stops and force turnovers," Zinke said. "The key to the game is being physical."

Zinke said the Patriot defense is impressive. "Cen-

tury is really physical and aggressive. Their linemen are big and their linebackers come hard on every play," he said. "It's about sustaining our blocks and the running backs running hard."

Janz said missing the playoffs would be difficult to swallow considering the athletic ability on the team.

"With the talent we have it would be kind of a big let-down to all of us if we didn't make the playoffs," he said. "That Bismarck game was kind of an eye-opener for us. We realize we need to work that much harder to make the playoffs now."

### AAA notes

Janz was unable to play football last fall. "I have a heart condition and last year I didn't get passed by my heart doctor. This year I got the OK to play," he said. ... Last week's victory was Bismarck's 17th straight over Mandan. ... Bismarck's Channing Mann ran for 289 yards against Mandan. That betters the school record of 282 set by Weston Dressler against Dickinson in 2003. ... Century won its ninth straight against Williston last week. ... Mandan's last victory over Century was in 2006. Century has won eight of the last nine. ... Bismarck has won three in a row over Minot and seven of 10.

# Former agent says college players paid

NEW YORK (AP) — A former sports agent tells Sports Illustrated he paid college football players early in his career, and several of them confirm it to the magazine.

Josh Luchs says in the Oct. 18 edition he paid more than 30 players from 1990-96, including many who didn't sign with him.

He says quarterback Ryan Leaf, the second pick in the 1998 draft who flopped in the NFL, took more than \$10,000, most of which he voluntarily paid back after signing with another agent. Leaf declined to comment on specific allegations.

Luchs also says he paid first-round picks Jamir Miller and Chris Mims. Miller, a linebacker from UCLA taken 10th by the Cardinals in 1994, declined comment. Mims, a defensive lineman from Tennessee taken 23rd by the Chargers in 1992, died in 2008.

Luchs was suspended for a year by the NFL Players Association in 2007 over the handling of a commission check. He says he's telling his story because "I don't want my career to be defined by that suspension."

Luchs says he didn't pay players while working with

Gary Wichard, the agent linked to the investigation of NCAA violations at North Carolina. But Luchs says Wichard and John Blake, the Tar Heels assistant who resigned amid the investigation, worked together in violation of NCAA rules in 2002. Wichard and Blake declined comment through their lawyers.

Luchs says Jonathan Ogden, the Baltimore Ravens 11-time Pro Bowl tackle, wouldn't take money but accepted concert tickets in violation of NCAA rules. Ogden confirmed the account.

Luchs lists more than 20 other players he says he paid: Michigan State's Tony Banks; Arizona's Rob Waldrop; Tennessee's Chuck Webb; Portland State's Darick Holmes; Illinois' Mel Agee; USC's Travis Claridge; Phalen Pounds, R. Jay Shaw and Delon Washington; Colorado's Kanavis McGhee, Joel Steed and Greg Thomas; Washington State's Leon Bender, Torey Hunter, Singor Mobley and John Rushing; and UCLA's Chris Alexander, Ryan Fien, Carl Greenwood, Othello Henderson, Vaughn Parker, Matt Soenksen and Bruce Walker.

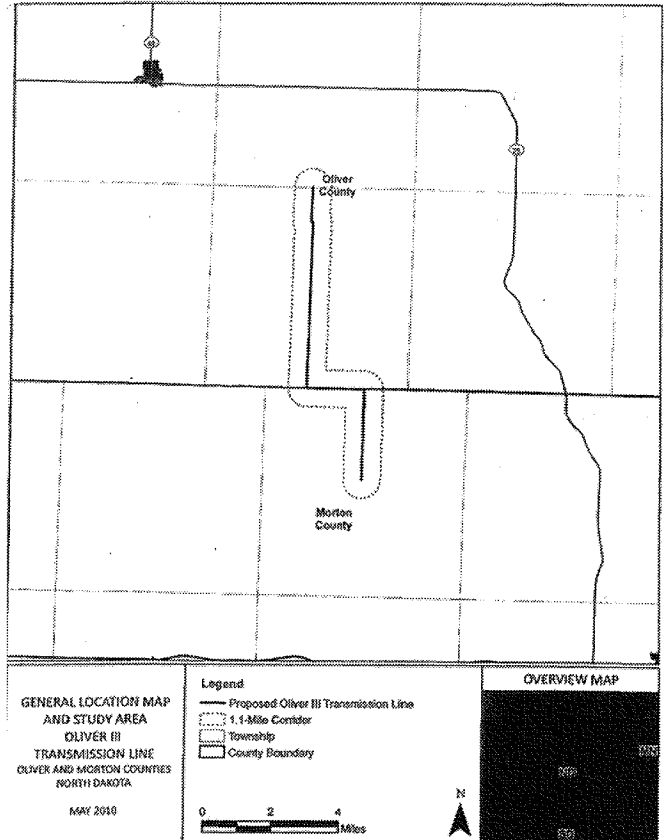

On March 19, 2010, NextEra Energy Resources, LLC (NextEra) filed an application for a waiver of procedures and time schedules, a corridor certificate and a route permit to authorize construction of 11 miles of 230 kV electric transmission line and associated facilities in Morton and Oliver Counties of North Dakota, as shown on the attached map. On May 12, 2010 NextEra requested to transfer this case to its subsidiary, Oliver Wind III, LLC as the applicant. Oliver Wind III, LLC requests the Commission waive procedures and time schedules set forth in North Dakota Century Code chapter 49-22 and North Dakota Admin. Code article 69-06 to allow a single consolidated application for corridor certificate and route permit and to hold a combined hearing on the waiver request and application for corridor certificate and route permit.
