Fool Bear said nickname supporters had hoped for a special council meeting,

but they couldn't make it work.

If the council agrees to put the nickname on the ballot, it will likely be at a special election because there's not tribal election scheduled this year.

Fool Bear and other nickname supporters have said they'd prefer an election sometime in June.

The tribe's approval is necessary if

UND is to keep the nickname as stipulated in a settlement between the state and the NCAA, which considers American Indian nicknames offensive.

The other Sioux tribe that needed to weigh in, Spirit Lake, had overwhelmingly approved the nickname in April 2009 with 67 percent of the vote.

Monday: 37.1 feet.

In Drayton, N.D., the Red River continues to rise toward a potential 2-foot major flood stage, perhaps by Wednesday. The river level was at 39.5 feet at late Monday afternoon.

The Red at Drayton is expected to reach about 43 feet by Saturday or

Sunday, and then stay at about the level.

The weather service has not yet issued a crest prediction for Drayton.

In Pembina, N.D., the Red River could rise by nearly 10 feet in the next week. The river level was at 42.61 feet at Monday afternoon.

The weather service predicts river levels in Pembina will continue climbing, reaching moderate flood stage of 47 feet by Wednesday. Major flood stage is 52 feet.

The present seven-day forecast for Pembina shows the river reaching 51.1 feet by next Monday.

In rural Grand Forks, water continues to flood dozens of roads.

About 25 residents in the East Lake neighborhood of the Burke Addition are cut off from roads, and are using boats to get from their homes to vehicles.

Meanwhile, the Drayton Bridge over the Red River closed overnight Sunday.

With the closing of the Drayton

Bridge, only four bridges over the Red River remain open between the Canadian border and Fargo.

They are:

N.D. Highway 200 (Interstate 29 Exit 100) south of Hillsboro, N.D., to Halstad, Minn.

U.S. Highway 2 (Gateway Drive) in Grand Forks.

N.D. Highway 5 (I-29 Exit 203) at Joliette, N.D., to Minn. Highway 175 and Hallock, Minn.

N.D. Highway 59 at Pembina, N.D.

In Oslo, Minn., highway access from the east remains cut off, as water is flowing over Minn. Highway 1. Local traffic is being allowed access to town from the North Dakota side of the river, along N.D. Highway 54, however.

Over the weekend, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers finished building a temporary dike along Main Street to protect the city from the rising river.
