On July 23, 2010, Bridger Pipeline LLC (Bridger) filed a combined application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit to authorize construction for approximately 77 miles of 12-inch crude oil pipeline in McKenzie, Dunn, and Billings Counties, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map. The Commission finds the combined application is complete.

A Public Hearing on the combined application is scheduled to begin September 9, 2010 at 12 noon, MDT, at the City Hall, 165 Railroad St. SE, Killdeer, North Dakota, 58640. The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location, construction,

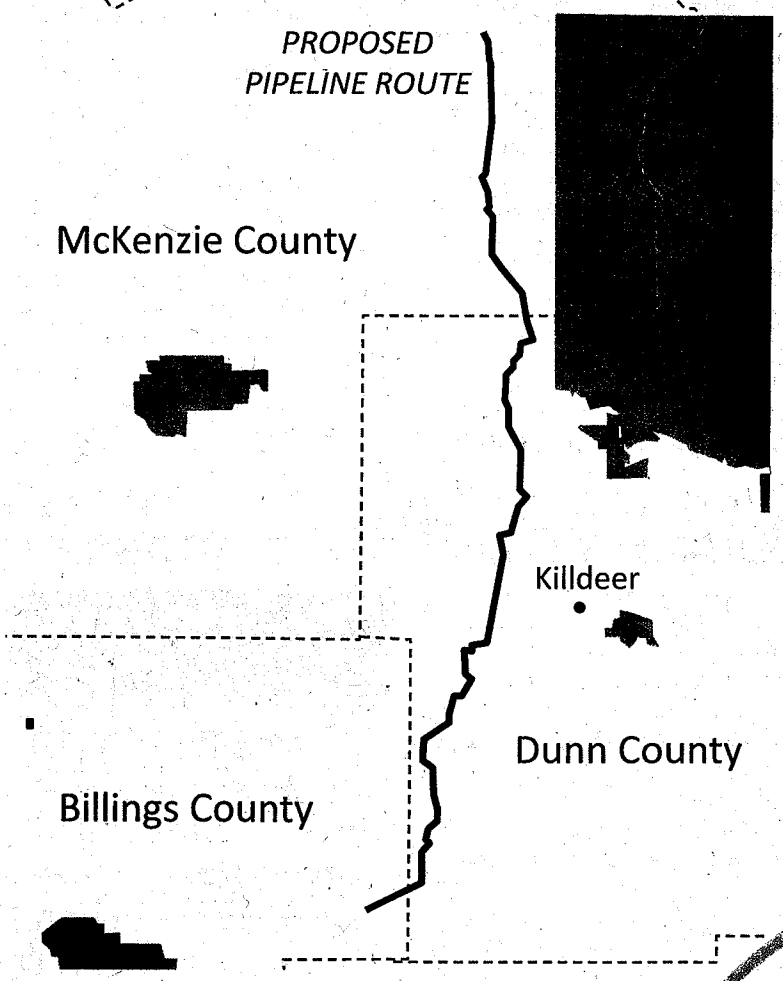
and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
