**NOTICE OF ORDER
REPRIMANDING ATTORNEY**
Disciplinary Board of the Supreme Court of the State of North Dakota, Petitioner v Donavin Grenz, Respondent
No. 4466-W-0609

A Hearing Panel of the Disciplinary Board found that Donavin Grenz violated N.D.R. Prof. Conduct 3.1, Meritorious Claims and Contentions. Grenz had represented two brothers who had disputes with a third brother over land owned by their deceased father. The parties reached a settlement in 2005 where Grenz's clients were to receive \$150,000 from the other brother and in exchange the clients were to cooperate with any quiet title action involving the deceased father's property. The judgement entered on the agreement did not provide for a money judgement for the \$150,000 nor did it specify a date to be paid nor for interest. Before the judgement was entered, Grenz filed a breach of contract lawsuit against the other brother for \$150,000 plus interest. The case was dismissed. Despite the denial of the money judgement sought, Grenz caused the original judgement to be filed in Logan and Kidder Counties as money judgements. Grenz did not advise the other party nor their attorney that he had docketed the original judgement as a money judgement for the purpose of levying upon it.

The Hearing Panel reprimanded Grenz and ordered that he pay costs of the disciplinary proceedings.

On April 29, 2009, in Case No. PU-07-54, the Commission issued Certificate of Site Compatibility for Energy Conversion Facility No. 11 to Just Wind, LLC, authorizing construction of its Logan County Wind Farm consisting of up to 368 MW of wind turbine generating capacity, collection substation and associated facilities in Logan County, North Dakota.

On March 5, 2010, in Case No. PU-10-58, Just Wind, LLC and Logan County Wind Farm, LLC submitted a joint application for the transfer of Certificate of Site Compatibility for Energy Conversion Facility No. 11 to Logan County Wind Farm, LLC, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Just Wind, LLC.

The issues to be considered in these matters are whether Logan County Wind Farm, LLC agrees and is able to comply with the terms and conditions of the certificate issued to Just Wind, LLC, and whether the requested transfer is compatible with the public interest.

Those interested are invited to comment on the application in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. Comments and requests for hearing must be received by April 30, 2010. If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a hearing.
