## Gladstone City Council Minutes Subject to approval

The regular monthly meeting of the Gladstone City was called to order by Mayor Kurtis Martin on May 3, 2010 at 7:30 PM. Council members present were Judy Hecker, Dennis Enger, Darrell Sadowsky and Darcy Fossum. Motion and second to approve the minutes of the April 4th and 5th as written, all aye.

**Sheriff's Report:** Deputy Arian Swanson presented the April patrol and security report 52.50 hours.

**Public Hearings:** Dave Wandler asked to purchase lots 21 - 24 Block 13 OP. Motion and second to let Wandler use lot 24 as a garden, all aye. Wandler said he would also hook to city water and pay his dog fine.

Kendall Boone asked the council if the baseball diamond lots on the west end of town could be used as a recreational vehicle track with dirt jumps. Auditor Lantz will check with the insurance company on the liability insurance requirements. Boone will get approval signatures of the residents living on the west side of town. Lori Beri presented pictures of two mobile homes she would like to move into the city. Neither home meets the year requirement set forth in the ordinance and one doesn't meet the size requirements. Mayor Martin said the remodeled home might be allowed in if she removes the home that is on the lot now. John Parker asked for an extension on siding his home as the weather has been a factor in getting it sided. Motion and second to give an extension until the end of June, all aye.

Council has received complaints on the building moved into town by Daryl Clark without a permit. Motion and second to have Attorney Nordsven send a letter giving Clark 30 days to remove the building from the city limits, all aye.

**Ben and Lillian Bondell** would like to have the city replace the juniper tree that was damaged during snow removal by the city employees. Mayor Martin said until Joe Nichols came and inspected the trees in town nothing would be done.

**Bills Paid:** Motion and second to pay the bills, all aye.

**Reports of City Officers:** Mayor Martin reported talking to Mary at SW Water about them acting as the certified water operator for the city. Mary was checking on some items and had not returned the call yet.

Mayor Martin and council members Hecker and Enger attended the energy impact meeting with Jeff Engleson on April 28th. Engleson said that more money would be given to smaller cities.

**Attorneys' Report:** Attorney Nordsven said two dog cases had been taken to court and dog given.

Attorney Nordsven had made small changes to both the water and stick build ordinances.

Second reading of ordinance 2010-01, an ordinance amending Chapter VI, Article II, Section 6.0201 of the City of Gladstone, Stark County, North Dakota. This ordinance states that all buildings used for human habitation shall be connected to the water works system. Motion and second to accept and pass, all aye.

Second reading of ordinance 2010-02, an ordinance amending Chapter V, Article VII, Section 5.0701 of the City ordinances of Gladstone, Stark County, North Dakota. This ordinance includes the definition of residential districts, Family - not over 93% of the lot area. Every residential building shall have a minimum width of 20 feet. Motion and second to accept and pass, all aye.

**Old Business:** Motion and second to buy a new shop door, all aye. Motion and second to include four windows and the 3" track, all aye.

All unlicensed dog owners will be cited and taken to court. Council decided to have Richardson draw up plans that include a wall, which would make a hall in front of the bathrooms in the present building.

Prairie Paving has checked the streets and there are a lot of new cracks that will need to be sealed this year.

Motion and second to have Attorney Nordsven draw up a resolution giving the builder and owner each a two year \$150,000.00 property tax exemption for new single family residential properties, condominium and town houses, all aye. Auditor Lantz said if the lots on block 22 were landscaped they could be sold immediately. Mayor Martin will check to see how much fill needs to be brought in to landscape and will talk to Jody Kosteleyk about getting fill off her parents land. Street sweeper is broke down again and Brost feels it will cost too much to repair this time. Mayor Martin will check with Swanson's to see if they have any in their inventory.

**New Business:** Motion and second to approve the Gladstone Volunteer Firefighters site authorization at The Enchanted Hideaway Bar, all aye.

## STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION Northern States Power Company Aggregators of Retail Customers Investigation

### Case No. PU-10-59 NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING May 12, 2010

On March 1, 2010, Northern States Power Company (NSP) filed comments and a request for action prohibiting the operation of Aggregators of Retail Customers (ARCs). ARCs would aggregate retail customer load reductions and sell the resulting energy in the Midwest Independent System Operator (Midwest ISO) wholesale energy market.

NSP states that a Midwest ISO federal tariff filed to comply with Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Order 719 would authorize ARCs to begin operating as soon as June 1, 2010, unless the Public Service Commission takes action to prohibit ARC operations. NSP contends that operation of ARCs may negatively impact customer rates, system reliability and existing demand response programs. Those interested are invited to comment in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. Comments and requests for hearings must be received by June 22, 2010. If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine these matters without a hearing. The issues to be determined in this proceeding are:

1. Whether ARC operations constitute resale of electricity by retail customers prohibited under North Dakota Administrative Code Section 69-09-02-15 unless the rate schedule under which the customer receives service specifically provides for resale?
2. Whether the Commission should prohibit or regulate the operation of ARCs and if operation should be regulated then how and to what extent?

The Board reconvened at 10:30 AM. Darren Czapiewski, Information Technology Coordinator and Recorder, Rae DeWeinberger requested the installation of wireless internet in the Recorder's office. Discussion was held regarding costs, execution and installation. A \$30.00 per time access fee will be charged to the user. Comm. Zander moved to accept the Recorder's request for wireless internet. Comm. Elkin seconded. All voted Aye and the motion carried.

Sheriff Clarence Tuhy gave an update on the task force and monthly transports. Sheriff Clarence Tuhy discussed the purchase of a transport van for civil process. Discussion was held regarding available funds in the Sheriff's budget.
