

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Commission of the County of Billings, North Dakota, will meet at the County Courthouse on the 6th day of July, 2010 at 11:30 AM, MT for the purpose of opening and considering bids for the furnishing of materials, labor, equipment and skill required for the purpose of crushing and stockpiling gravel and incidental items in and for said County, as is more fully described and set forth in the plans and specifications therefore, which are now on file in the office of the County Auditor.

Bids will be received on the following approximate quantities and types of work:

Crushing and Stockpiling Gravel
W1/2 SW1/4 - Section 30-138-102 - 30,000 C.Y.

Copies of the plans and specifications and other bidding and contract documents may be obtained from the County Auditor at the Billings County Courthouse or Kadmas, Lee & Jackson, Consulting Engineers, 677 27th Avenue East, Dickinson, North Dakota 58601.

All bids are to be submitted on the basis of cash payment for the work and materials, and each bid shall be accompanied by a separate envelope containing a bidder's bond in a sum equal to five per cent (5%) of the full amount of the bid, executed by the bidder as principal and by a surety company authorized to do business in this state, conditioned that if the principal's bid be accepted and the contract awarded to him, he, within ten (10) days after notice of award, will execute and effect a contract in accordance with the terms of his bid and a contractor's bond as required by the laws of the State of North Dakota and the regulations and determinations of the County Commission of Billings County, North Dakota.

All bidders must be licensed for the highest amount of their bids, as provided by Section 43-07-05 of the North Dakota Century Code.

Contracts shall be awarded on the basis of the low bid submitted by a responsible and responsive bidder for the aggregate sum of all bid items. A single contract will be awarded for the work.

All bids will be contained in a sealed envelope, as above provided, plainly marked showing that such envelope contains a bid for the above project. In addition, the bidder shall place upon the exterior of such envelope the following information:

1. The work covered by the bidder
2. The name of the bidder
3. Separate envelope containing bid bond and a copy of Contractor's License or Renewal Certificate
4. Acknowledgement of the Addenda.

The work shall be completed by December 31, 2010.

The County Commission reserves the right to reject any and all bids to waive any informality in any bid, to hold all bids for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days from the date of opening bids, and to accept the bid deemed most favorable to the interest of Billings County.

Should the Contractor fail to complete the work within the time required herein or within such extra time as may have been granted by formal extensions of time approved by the Owner, there will be deducted from any amount due the Contractor the sum of \$200 per day for each day and every day that the completion of the work is delayed. The Contractor and his surety will be liable for any excess. Such payment will be as and for liquidated damages and not as a penalty.

All bidders are invited to be present at the public opening of the bids.
