Rural cable systems to show debates

BISMARCK, N.D. (AP) — A dozen rural telephone companies plan to show the North Dakota House and Senate's floor debates during the next Legislature.

Spokesman Seth Arndorfer says the companies offer cable TV service to about 30,000 North Dakota households, and they want more local content.

Legislative video is already shown live on the Internet.

Daily coverage alternates between the House and Senate.

The video feed comes from a camera in the balcony.

Arndorfer says the video is antiquated, and he says a larger audience may provide an incentive to improve the Legislature's video coverage.

Senate Republican majority leader Bob Stenehjem wants more information about how the video can be used.

He's concerned that lawmaker gaffes could show up in campaign ads.

Officials say pebbles broke windows

CHICAGO (AP) — Chicago officials say white pebbles spread on rooftops to reflect sunlight are to blame for some broken high-rise windows in last week's violent storms.

The white pebbles are put on roofs to lessen the need for air conditioning in the buildings.

Jose Santiago, director of Chicago's Office of Emergency Management, said Monday that the 77 mph winds that hit the city Friday afternoon picked up an unusual number of the pebbles and pelted them against windows.

One of the buildings where windows were broken was the 110-story Willis Tower, long known as the Sears Tower. Two windows in the imposing black building were broken.

Detention for girl in bus tunnel beating

SEATTLE (AP) — A 15-year-old girl has been sentenced to 15 to 36 weeks in a juvenile detention facility for the beating of another teenage girl at the Seattle bus tunnel that was captured on surveillance video.

The Seattle girl had pleaded guilty earlier this month to second-degree assault on the Jan. 28 attack.

The widely viewed video showed uniformed security guards doing nothing to stop the beating. The attack prompted changes in bus tunnel security, including allowing security guards to intervene in tunnel fights rather than merely "observe and report."

The two girls had a long-standing dispute.

Gov. to visit flooded Devils Lake basin

DEVILS LAKE, N.D. (AP) — Gov. John Hoeven will visit the Devils Lake basin to meet with officials dealing with flooding in the region.

Hoeven will meet with Devils Lake and Ramsey County officials around 9 a.m. Tuesday at the Devils Lake City Hall.

He then plans to meet with Minnewaukan and Benson County officials later in the morning at the Benson County Courthouse.

On Monday, Hoeven directed the North Dakota National Guard and Department of Emergency Services to work with Benson and Ramsey County officials to help in the wake of heavy rains that fell in the area Monday.

The proposed monthly increase for a residential customer using 750 kilowatt-hours in a month is \$7.63. A public hearing on this matter will be held beginning November 8, 2010 at 8:30 a.m. CDT (7:30 a.m. MDT) in the Commission hearing room, State Capitol, 12th Floor, Bismarck, North Dakota 58505.
