Public Notice**Kenmare School Board
Meeting Minutes
October 19, 2010**

A regular meeting of the Board of Education, Kenmare Public School No. 28, was held on Tuesday, October 19, 2010 at 7:30 p.m. in the ITV room at the Kenmare Public School.

Directors King, R. Johnson, Rodin, Zimmer, Kostad, Christensen and Ellsworth were present. Also present were Superintendent Mueller, Principal Faul, community members, staff members and the news media.

President Rodin called the meeting to order. Moved by Director R. Johnson and seconded by Director Ellsworth to approve the minutes of the September meeting as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Treasurer's Report reviewed by the board. The balance in the General Fund is \$637,229.07, the balance in the Building Fund is \$203,537.58 the hot lunch balance is \$1,280.68 and the High School Activities balance is \$63,451.07.

Moved by Director Christensen and seconded by Director King to approve the bills as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Director R. Johnson reported the Policy Committee met on October 7th. Moved by Director R. Johnson and seconded by Director Zimmer to approve the 1st reading of the Evaluation Policy. Motion carried unanimously. The committee also discussed the Head Lice Policy. Supt. Mueller mentioned some changes that are being suggested by the NDSBA and First District Health. It was decided

to allow Supt. Mueller to spend up to \$25,000 when looking for a replacement vehicle for the van. Motion opposed by Director Christensen. Motion carried 1. Moved by Director Zimmer and seconded by Director Ellsworth to purchase the 72 inch finisher mower from Gooseneck Implement for \$2867.00. Motion carried unanimously.

Director Ellsworth reported Curriculum/Technology Committee met to discuss the condition of current textbooks being used in the district. Supt. Mueller stated the elementary textbooks are current and felt if we continue with the budget what we have in the district we will be able to remain current. Principal Faul reported that some of the textbooks that are being used by the staff and in some circumstances the instructors prefer to continue with the older books. Principal Faul gave the board a copy of what is currently being used in grades 7-12.

There was also discussion about providing students with computers and what the plan should be for the future to keep our school district moving forward in the area. Supt. Mueller reported that an elementary school may be eligible for a \$100,000 grant to be used towards technology and determining what should be purchased needs to be researched further. The board was given the Information concerning a technology levy (1% and there was discussion about whether we should vote on this issue at the next annual election. The committee is recommending we incorporate band into the curriculum and this be done
