RE: Enbridge Pipelines (North Dakota) LLC
Certification Letter for Tank Construction at Maxbass Station

Dear Sirs and Madame:

In accordance with North Dakota Century Code § 49-22-03(3) (2009), this correspondence is to notify the North Dakota Public Service Commission ("Commission") that Enbridge Pipelines (North Dakota) LLC ("Enbridge") intends to construct a 10,000 barrel tank for storage of crude petroleum at its Maxbass Station¹, located in Bottineau County, North Dakota. Enbridge requests that the Commission acknowledge receipt of this certification letter and schedule a Preconstruction Conference at its earliest convenience. Enbridge intends to commence civil construction at Maxbass Station as early as June 1, 2010.

Enbridge certifies that this construction will be restricted to the geographic location in which previous construction took place and in which the present facilities are bounded by a permanent fence. (see attached DWG NO. 706-C-01001). Additionally, Enbridge certifies that its construction activities will not affect any known exclusion or avoidance area, as defined in North Dakota Administrative Code 69-06-08-02 (2009). Also, Enbridge certifies that it will comply with all the rules and regulations of all other agencies having jurisdiction over any phase of construction described herein. Presently, Enbridge is seeking the approval of the North Dakota Department of Health for Air Quality and Hydrostatic Test Water Discharge Permits for the Maxbass site. Enbridge is also asking the State Water Commission to issue a Water Appropriation Permit. Finally, Enbridge certifies that there are no "affected landowners" for purposes of this construction; as such, no waivers are required.

As stated above, Enbridge intends to construct a 10,000 barrel tank for storage of crude petroleum at its Maxbass Station, which is located on Enbridge fee-owned land. Upon approval, Enbridge will provide the name of its Contractor(s) in order to schedule a Preconstruction Conference. Presently, it's envisioned that the Contractor(s) will commence preparation of the Maxbass Station site, grading,

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
excavation, and tank construction on June 1, 2010, with commissioning of the tank scheduled for December 9, 2010.

Enbridge sincerely appreciates the time and attention the Public Service Commission and its Staff has given this matter. I am available at the contact numbers identified above should the Commission require further information, and to coordinate the scheduling of a Preconstruction Conference as soon as possible, preferably prior to June 1, 2010.

CERTIFICATION OF APPLICANT PURSUANT TO N.D. CENT. CODE 49-22-03(3)

ENBRIDGE PIPELINES (NORTH DAKOTA) LLC

I, Brent Horton, a duly authorized agent of Enbridge Pipelines (North Dakota) LLC (“Enbridge”), do hereby certify under oath:

1. That Enbridge and/or its legal predecessor(s) in interest constructed and developed facilities at Maxbass Station, Bottineau County, North Dakota prior to April 9, 1975;
2. That the construction activities to commence on or about June 1, 2010, shall take place upon land owned in fee by Enbridge and shall be restricted to the geographical location and within the man-made boundaries at Maxbass Station;
3. That no additional lands have been acquired adjacent to the existing Enbridge facilities;
4. That the construction activities to take place will not affect any known exclusion or avoidance area; and
5. That Enbridge will comply with reasonable requests of the North Dakota Public Service Commission (NDPSC) in executing construction at Maxbass Station, including attending a Preconstruction Conference Call with NDPSC Staff, informing NDPSC of the start of construction, submitting weekly reports on construction, providing copies of all applicable permits, and constructing and operating the facility in accordance with applicable safety requirements.

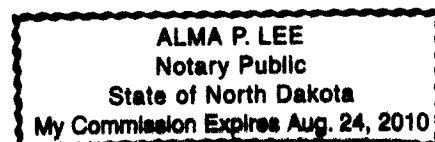

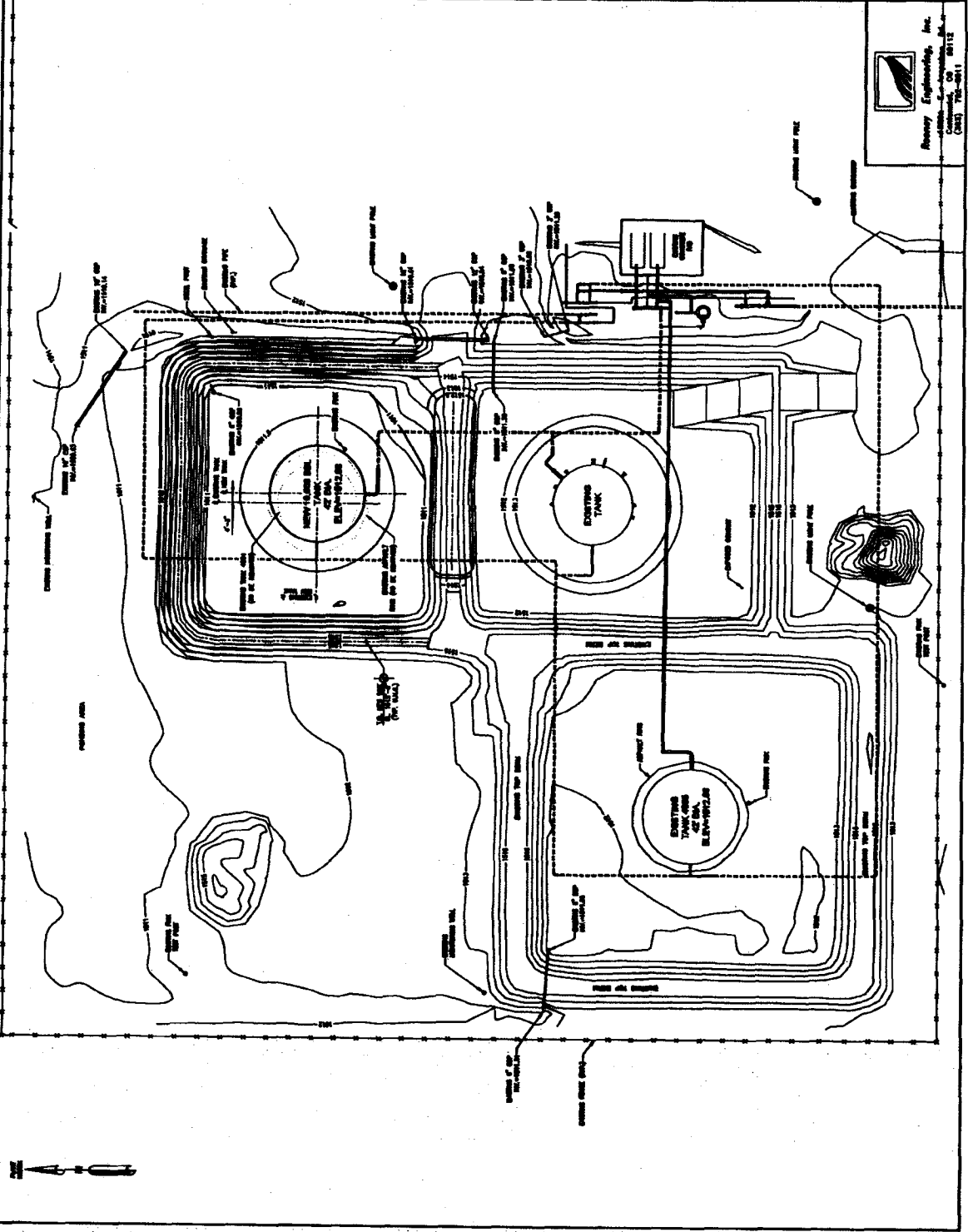
