

# Wimbledon — Day 1

■ Federer was 199-28 with a record 16 titles in Grand Slam action and reached the final at 18 of the past 20 major tournaments; Falla was 11-14, once making it as far as the third round at a Slam.

All of that is why this match was the talk of Day 1 at the grass-court Grand Slam tournament, with players gathering around televisions in the locker rooms to catch a glimpse.

"I don't think anyone expected it," said No. 5 Andy Roddick, a three-time Wimbledon runner-up who beat Rajeev Ram of Carmel, Ind., later Monday. "Everyone was pretty surprised, especially when it became very, very real there in the latter stages."

Indeed, Falla's near-defeat of Federer generated much more buzz than any of the upsets that actually occurred.

The seeded men who exited were No. 11 Marin Cilic, No. 17 Ivan Ljubicic, No. 20 Stanislas Wawrinka and No. 30 Tommy Robredo. No. 3 Novak Djokovic, the 2008 Australian Open champion, appeared on his way to joining them, but he

came back to beat Olivier Rochus of Belgium in a match that finished at about 11 p.m., with the Centre Court roof closed and the lights on.

There was one surprise of significance in the women's draw: No. 5-seeded Francesca Schiavone lost to 47th-ranked Vera Dushevina of Russia, making Schiavone only the second reigning French Open women's champion to lose in the first round at Wimbledon in the 42-year Open era.

"I didn't have a lot of energy today," said Schiavone, who became Italy's first female Grand Slam champion two weeks and two days ago. "It was very close, but she took advantage of her chances, and I didn't."

The only other time a French Open champ bowed out in her opening Wimbledon match was in 2005, when it happened to Justine Henin. The Belgian began a 20-month hiatus from tennis in 2008, and returned to

Continued from 1D Wimbledon for the first time in three years Monday, advancing with a 6-4, 6-3 victory over Anastasiya Sevastova of Latvia.

Also returning: Kim Clijsters, who hadn't played at the All England Club since 2006. The two-time U.S. Open champion, away from the tour entirely for 2½ years while getting married and having a daughter, had no problems in beating Maria Elena Camerin of Italy 6-0, 6-3.

Not surprisingly, Henin and Clijsters — neither of whom has won Wimbledon — were thrilled to be back.

"We breathe tennis, we live tennis, over here. You feel the tradition of the game," Henin said, then added: "Playing in white is a good feeling."

Venus Williams adhered to Wimbledon's strict dress code Monday, switching from the black lace outfit that drew so much attention at the French Open to more traditional attire.

"Here it's all about white," Williams said after eliminating Rossana de los Rios of Paraguay. "There is no illusion this

time. My dress was inspired by Tina Turner. It's a fun, elegant dress."

Her bid for a sixth Wimbledon championship got off to a much more straightforward start than Federer's quest for a record-tying seventh.

Only twice in the Open era has the defending Wimbledon champion lost in the first round, but Federer appeared to be heading in that direction against the left-handed Falla. Here's one additional reason why the tightness of their match caught everyone off-

guard: These guys met four times previously, and Federer won each time, taking all 11 sets.

Thanks to the luck — or, from Falla's perspective, the bad luck — of the draw, they were playing each other for the third time in the past four weeks. "Everybody wants to play Federer," Falla said, then broke into a wide grin before delivering the laugh line: "But three times in one month is a lot."

In this case, familiarity did not breed contempt, but rather confidence.

Continued from 1D Williams said sitting out the team's voluntary workouts in the offseason was "a blessing" because his wife has been having a difficult pregnancy. Williams said he worked out with a trainer and other NFL players while he was away from the team.

"Basically, that's why I've been gone, was taking care of my wife," Williams said. Now Williams is back while Harris, the player Williams had to step up and replace late last season, remains sidelined after a season-ending left knee injury against San Francisco Nov. 22.

"I think Al is going to be definitely challenged to make it at the beginning of training camp," McCarthy said.

Harris didn't dispute that he might miss the start of training camp, but insisted he would be ready to start the regular season opener.

"There's no doubt in my mind," Harris said. "That was my goal from day one, and that's still my goal today."

Bigby could be headed toward a long-term contract impasse with the team, but McCarthy passed on the chance to criticize him.

"You definitely probably have a little more leniency or understanding toward an individual that you have gone to battle with," McCarthy said. "Atari Bigby has been here through offseason programs. I have watched Atari grow as a football player from NFL Europe, so I do appreciate his (situation). He is trying to do what he feels is in his best interest as a professional football player and for his family, and I respect that."

On May 12, 2010, Midcontinent Communications (Midcontinent) filed notice with the Commission that Midcontinent had by letters dated April 16, 2010 and April 23, 2010 made bona fide requests under 47 U.S.C. § 251(c) for wholesale resale of telecommunications services for the Willow City, Dunsieith and Bisbee, North Dakota exchanges from Turtle Mountain Communications, Inc. (Turtle Mountain).

Under 47 U.S.C. § 251(f)(1)(A) a rural telephone company is exempt from the requirements of Section 251(c) until it receives a bona fide request and until the state commission determines that the exemption should be terminated. Midcontinent requests that the Commission conduct an inquiry for the purpose of determining whether to terminate the Turtle Mountain's 47 U.S.C. § 251(f)(1)(A) exemption from providing its services for resale.

1. Whether the request of Midcontinent is unduly economically burdensome.
2. Whether the request of Midcontinent is technically feasible.
3. Whether the request of Midcontinent is consistent with 47 U.S.C. § 254 (other than subsections (b)(7) and (c)(1)(D) thereof).
4. The implementation schedule for compliance with the request should the exemption be terminated.
5. If Turtle Mountain's exemption under 47 U.S.C. § 251(f)(1)(A) is terminated, whether the exemption is to be terminated for the whole company.
6. If Turtle Mountain's exemption under 47 U.S.C. § 251(f)(1)(A) is terminated, whether the exemption is to be terminated for all services required under 47 U.S.C. § 251(c).
