### CORRECTED NOTICE OF FILING AND NOTICE OF HEARING

March 18, 2011

On February 7, 2011, Montana-Dakota Utilities Co., A division of MDU Resources Group, Inc., (MDU) filed an application for a waiver of procedures and time schedules, a corridor certificate and a route permit to authorize construction of approximately 30 miles of 230 kV electric transmission line and associated facilities in Dickey and McIntosh Counties of North Dakota, as shown on the attached map. MDU requests the Commission waive procedures and time schedules set forth in North Dakota Century Code chapter

49-22 and North Dakota Administrative Code article 69-06 to allow for a single consolidated application for corridor certificate and route permit and to hold a combined hearing on the waiver request and application for corridor certificate and route permit.

On March 9, 2011 the Commission issued a Notice of Filing and Notice of Hearing, erroneously scheduling a public hearing on the application to be held in LaMoure County at Edgeley. That Public Hearing is now scheduled to begin April 15, 2011, at 1:00 p.m. CDT at the Dickey County Courthouse, 309 2nd St, Ellendale, ND 58436. The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the

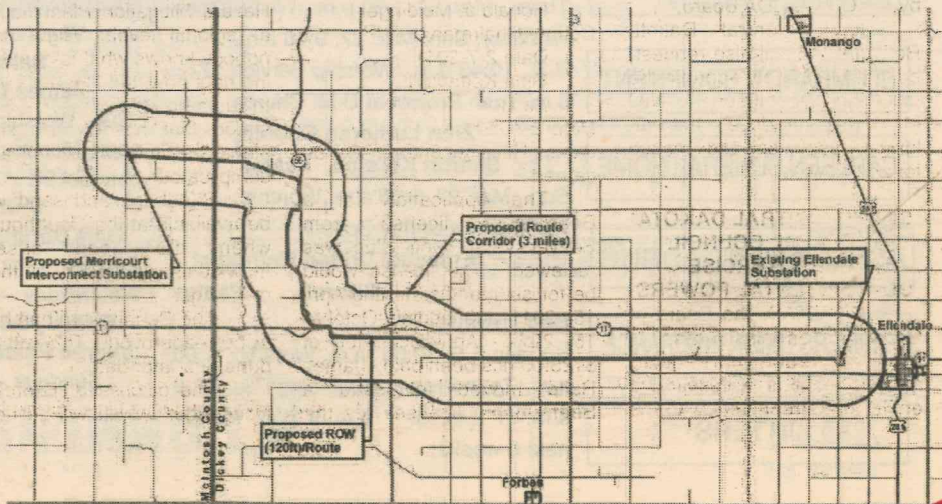
efficient use of resources?

3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

4. Is it appropriate for the Commission to waive procedures and time schedules as requested, including the request for a single consolidated application for corridor certificate and route permit?
