

# Fun Recipes for the Whole Family

## Cola Burgers

- 1 1/2 lbs Beef - Ground
- 1 Eggs
- 2 Tablespoons Cheese - Parmesan (Grated)
- 1/2 Cup (Crushed) Saltine Crackers
- 1/2 Cup (divided) Soda - Coke
- 6 Tablespoons (Divided) Salad Dressing - French

Preheat a grill for high heat. When the grill is hot, lightly oil the grate. In a medium bowl, mix together the egg, 1/4 cup of cola, crackers, 2 tablespoons of French dressing, and Parmesan cheese. Crumble in the ground beef, and mix well. Form into 6 balls, and pat into 3/4 inch patties. Pour the remaining cola and dressing into a small bowl, and mix well.

Grill burgers for about 3 minutes per side. Brush with the dressing and cola, then grill for 8 to 10 more minutes, basting occasionally.

## Cola Buffalo Wings

- 4 lbs Chicken - Wings, tips discarded
- 1 Teaspoon Seasoning - Garlic Salt
- 1 Cup Sugar - Brown
- 2 Tablespoons Soy Sauce
- 1 Teaspoon Seasoning - Onion Powder
- 1 (12 oz) Can Soda - Coke

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F (165 degrees C). Place chicken wings in a shallow casserole dish. Season with garlic salt and onion salt. Mix cola, sugar, and soy sauce; pour mixture over chicken wings.

Bake, covered, at 325 degrees F (165 degrees C) for 2 hours. Turn wings over every 30 minutes. Uncover, and bake for an additional 1 to 2 hours. Turn wings every 30 minutes or so.

# An important lesson adults before they le

(ARA) - Young adults learn many things over the years, but there's one lesson they shouldn't forget before they head to college or they set off on their own - how to manage credit.

While parents should teach their children about how credit card works, card providers like Wells Fargo offer online credit card education material that can be reviewed at any time. Wells Fargo also sponsors money management lessons at handsonteaching.com that are taught in classrooms and community centers across the United States.

- \* For students, look for a college credit card that offers zero liability for fraudulent purchases and text alerts to help manage and protect your account.

- \* Young adults need to understand that credit cards are loans that need to be paid back. A great introductory lesson for them is to use it to buy books or another necessary purchase. Even if mom and dad are paying for the item purchased, parents can use this as an example of how to build credit by using a credit card for planned purchase that you can afford.

**NOTICE OF RESCHEDULED HEARING**  
 April 15, 2011

On February 7, 2011, Montana-Dakota Utilities Co., A division of MDU Resources Group, Inc., (MDU) filed an application for a waiver of procedures and time schedules, a corridor certificate and a route permit to authorize construction of approximately 30 miles of 230 kV electric transmission line and associated facilities in Dickey and McIntosh Counties of North Dakota, as shown on the attached map. MDU requests the Commission waive procedures and time schedules set forth in North Dakota Century Code chapter 49-22 and North Dakota Ad-

ministrative Code article 69-06 to allow for a single consolidated application for corridor certificate and route permit and to hold a combined hearing on the waiver request and application for corridor certificate and route permit.

On March 18, 2011 the Commission issued a Corrected Notice of Filing and Notice of Hearing to be held April 15, 2011. That public hearing was cancelled due to inclement weather and is now rescheduled to begin May 12, 2011, at 2:00 p.m. CDT at the Dickey County Courthouse, 309 2nd St, Ellendale, ND 58436. The issues to be considered are:

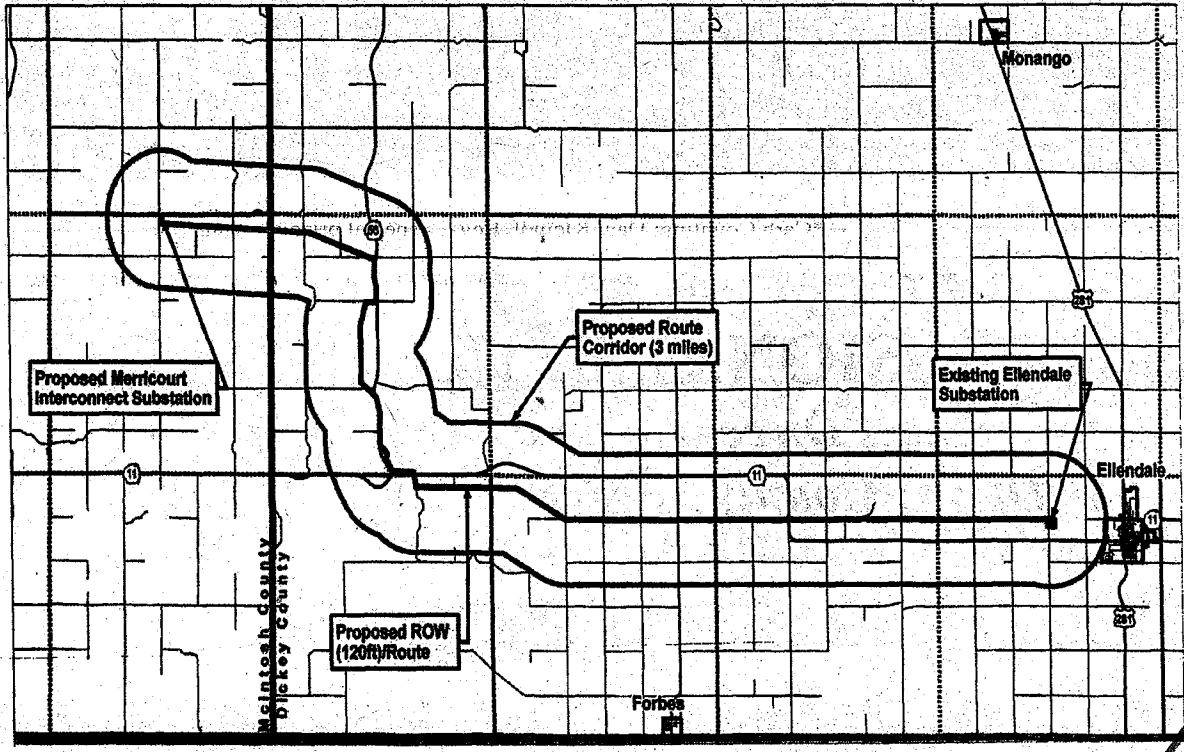
1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environ-

mental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

4. Is it appropriate for the Commission to waive procedures and time schedules as requested, including the request for a single consolidated application for corridor certificate and route permit?

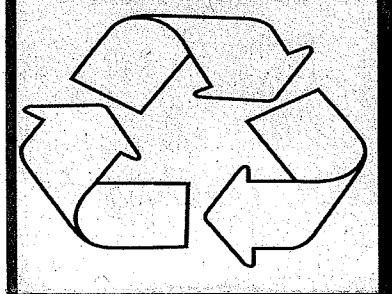
