NOTICE OF FILING AND NOTICE OF HEARING

On June 21, 2011, BakkenLink Pipeline, LLC (BakkenLink) filed applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit to authorize construction for approximately 144 miles of 8-inch and 12-inch crude oil pipeline in Billings, Dunn, McKenzie, Stark and Williams Counties, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map. The trunkline will have bi-directional capability, and will be able to transport crude oil between Beaver Lodge and a new rail facility at Fryburg, North Dakota. BakkenLink also filed a request for waiver of procedures and time schedules established under North Dakota Century Code Chapter 49-22 and North Dakota Administrative Code Chapter 69-06-06. The Commission finds the applications are complete.

A Public Hearing on the applications is scheduled to begin September 1, 2011 at 10 a.m. CDT, McKenzie County Court House, 201 5th Street NW, Watford City, North Dakota, 58854. The issues to be considered are:

1. Is the proposed facility of such

length, design, location, or purpose that it will produce minimal adverse effects, or, does a demonstrable emergency exist which requires immediate construction and that adherence to the procedures and time schedules would jeopardize the utility's system?

2. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?

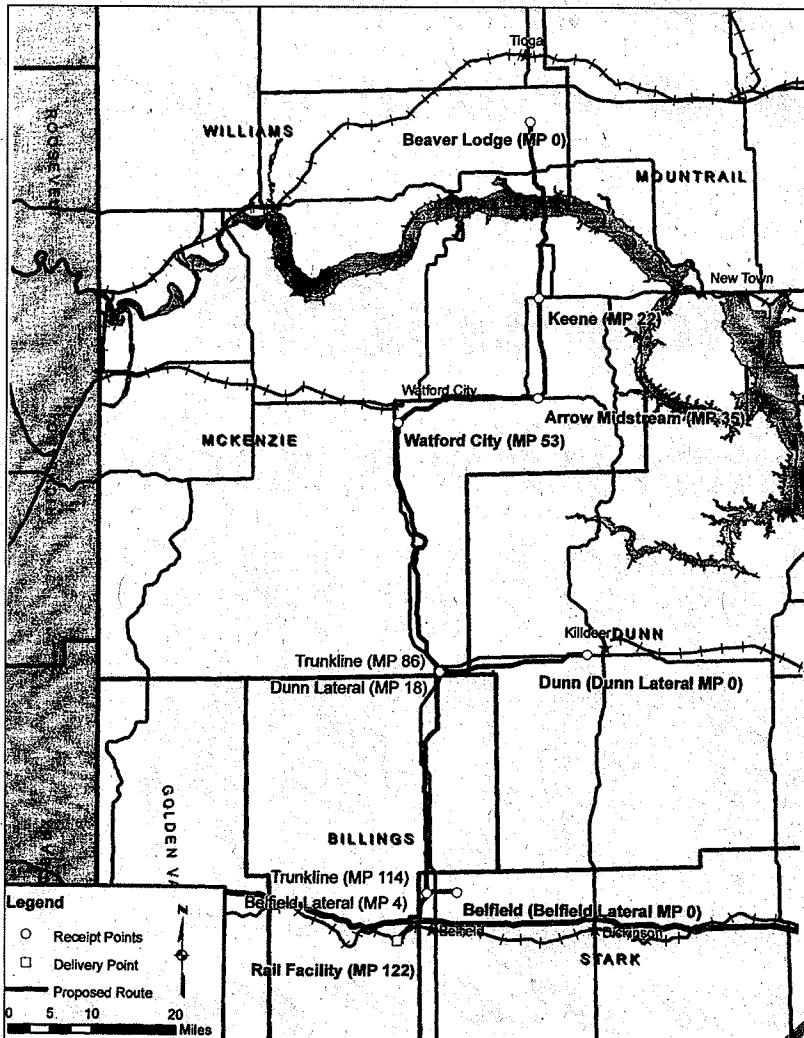
3. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?

4. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

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Ray Regular City Commission Meeting Minutes

Call to Order - The meeting of the Ray City Board of Commissioners was called to order by Vice President Eide at 7:07 p.m. with the following commissioners present: Benjie Foss, Todd Murschel and Myron Eide. Commissioners Absent: Gerald Ranum and Larry Viall. Also present were City Auditor Kim Steffan, Traci Papineau, Mike Steffan, Mark Cahoon, Dennis Pearce, Diane Meckle, Robb Hatten, Tom Wheeler and Troy Kupper.

Presenters

Dennis Pearce - Pearce presented a preliminary plan for truck parking and 27, four bedroom units for housing.

Murschel moved, Foss seconded to approve the preliminary plan for housing for Mark Cahoon pending the information received from R&T Water, Department of Transportation regarding the approach and the lagoon capacity, excluding the Southwest approach at this time. Motion carried unanimously.

Truck Parking - Cahoon inquired about truck parking in the graveled lot west of the mall. The west parking lot is set aside for trucks and the city would rather see the trucks parking on the west lot instead of the city mall parking lot.

Extension - Cahoon requested an extension to build on lots 15-16-17 Block 2 Original Townsite where apartment buildings are meant to be built. Cahoon stated they were going to try to have the buildings up so they can be finished inside during the winter and be completed by spring of 2012. The deed to Lindholm's stated if they started construction by November 15, 2011 he would be in compliance.

Minutes - The minutes from the regular meeting held on July 11, 2011 were reviewed. Murschel moved, Foss seconded to approve the minutes from the July 11, 2011 meeting as presented. Motion carried unanimously.
