Tebow's night was punctuated by a run up the middle on the final play, a bruising 7-yard TD rumble that was reminis- cent of so many in his career with the Gators.

"It was a great play," said Quinn, a former first-round pick of the Browns after a standout career at Notre Dame. "He did a great job running it in."

After the game, Tebow was besieged by autograph seekers — in his own locker room, no less. Two media members asked him to sign some items, before being booted by the Broncos' public relations staff.

Tebow simply shrugged off the episode.

Quinn's trying to do the same with his lackluster performance. He completed 6 of 16 passes for 68 yards against the Bengals.

He insisted he wasn't pressing or thinking too much on the field. And he's definitely not reading anything into the performances of Orton and Tebow.

"I think the biggest thing is you have to kind of control the things that you do out there," Quinn said. "We're all working toward the same goal."

### If healthy, Blackmon provides versatility for Green Bay

GREEN BAY, Wis. — Sometimes, Will Blackmon's versatility even surprises his teammates.

Exhibit A came early in training camp, when wide receiver

### Greg Jennings ran his route and plowed straight into a safety. Then Jennings looked up and did a double-take.

"He looked up and said, 'Safety?'" Blackmon said. "He said, 'I didn't know you were at safety.' I said, 'Yeah, they're not getting rid of me.'"

Blackmon spent the off-season preparing to move from cornerback to safety, although he'll still try to get some snaps at cornerback when the Packers deploy their nickel and dime defenses. And he'll try to play a featured role in the Packers' return game.

If he can stay healthy, that is. Blackmon is less than 10 months removed from surgery on his left anterior cruciate ligament, the latest and most serious in a string of injuries that have held back the 2006 fourth-round pick out of Boston College.

Blackmon has been a sporadic participant in Packers camp so far. But he was practicing Tuesday after an extended absence, and insists he will be ready for the Sept. 12 opener at Philadelphia.

"It's not even a concern about the opener," Blackmon said. "The main thing is just make sure that I do this, come back strong, do it right. Because I will say this whole injury is a nine to 11 month (recovery). I'm in month nine. So I could sit there, be cool and be prideful, and be like 'I came back in seven months, I came back in eight months,' tell them how strong I am. The bottom line is, six-seven-eight-nine-10-11 months, as long as you're ready by the first game, that's the most important thing."

With depth issues in the defensive backfield and a need

for Favre proved anything last year, it's that skipping training camp is no big deal for him. He delivered one of his finest seasons and brought the Vikings to the brink of the Super Bowl.

He took a beating at the Superdome, yet still threw for 310 yards and a touchdown. But he also threw two interceptions, the last one in Saints territory that cost the team a chance at a game-winning field goal try.

Now, after another summer of indecision and another (classic) rock star-like arrival, it appears that Favre is back for one more shot at a second Super Bowl title.

"That's definitely a sign," Shiancoe tweeted, "that the 2010 season is here!"

is, however, under contract — the second season in a three-year, \$25 million deal.

The Vikings instead issued a media schedule for Wednesday, announcing that coach Brad Childress will hold his regular press conference following practice. The team also said that "media availability with Brett Favre is to be determined."

Favre will turn 41 in October and has flirted with retirement in the past few years, while playing for the Green Bay Packers, the New York Jets and now the Vikings.

He threw 33 touchdowns and 11 interceptions last season and helped Minnesota reach the

### NFC title game.

The three-time MVP had been thinking about hanging it up again this year after injuring his ankle in January's NFC championship loss to New Orleans. He had surgery on his left ankle in June, and told teammates and some team officials earlier in August that it hadn't healed enough for him to return for a 20th NFL season.

Yet no one in the organization fully bought into that — partly because they went through a similar ordeal in 2009.

Last year, Favre told the team on the eve of training camp that he was going to stay retired only to return the Tuesday after their first preseason game. The Vikings played their

first exhibition game of 2010, a 28-7 win over the Rams, on Saturday and will visit San Francisco on Sunday night this week.

Not to mention, soon after Favre showed signs of waffling this year, his agent said he'd play if he was healthy.

Tarvaris Jackson was in line to be the starting quarterback if Favre had not returned, and he said after practice that he wasn't bothered by hearing that some of his higher profile teammates flew to Mississippi to try to woo Favre.

"I feel like if my number's called I'm going to be ready," Jackson said after practice. "And I'm going to continue to try to work hard and get better. That's all I can do."

### Wheeler just trying to stay on top

Greg Wheeler has had a season's worth of success.

Now, he's ready for the payoff.

Wheeler, a 39-year-old from Billings, Mont., hopes to keep his 18 Chevrolet Nova out of the Pure Stocks title.

"That's the main thing is to not race anything up in the heat and get out and turn the laps in the feature," Wheeler said. "I've got to at

knowing you need to run good. You can't just safety up and run toward the back."

### Late Model Tour an addition to title night

NLRA competition director Adam Fischer expects more than 20 Late Model cars to be at the Southwest Speedway for tonight's races.

Fischer said the Tour had big nights in Jamestown and Minot last Saturday and Sunday, respectively, before the car count unexpectedly fell off a bit for Monday night's races in Estevan.

He expects the count to be back in the mid-20's tonight and Thursday when the Tour wraps up at the Dacotah Speedway in Mandan.

"Dickinson and Mandan will have higher car counts, just because of the location," Fischer
