

United States beats France in first exhibition game

NEW YORK (AP) — Even the old guy found something new in the young Americans' debut.

"First time I've been in the Garden and the people have been cheering for me," Chauncey Billups said.

Billups scored 17 points, nine in an early third-quarter flurry that broke open the game, and the United States

beat France 86-55 on Sunday in its only home exhibition before the world championships.

Rudy Gay had 19 points to lead the Americans, who started slowly in their first tuneup before running away from the French in the second half. Billups, one of the few players on the roster with international experi-

ence, made three 3-pointers while playing just 15 minutes.

The 33-year-old Billups, who played for the U.S. in the 2007 Olympic qualifier, expected some nerves from a roster that includes five 21-year-olds.

"Now you're really playing a real game," he said. "You're on TV and it doesn't mean

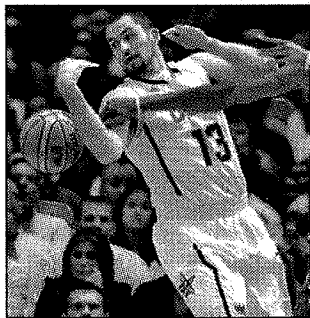
that much but internally it does because we're trying to work toward something."

Kevin Durant added 14 points and eight rebounds for the Americans, who open the world championships on Aug. 28 against Croatia.

France surrendered a 16-4 run early in the third quarter after staying close with the Americans in the first

half. "The second half I just thought we just settled down," U.S. coach Mike Krzyzewski said. "You don't have to be perfect. Every shot you take doesn't have to go in."

The Americans trimmed their roster to 13 earlier Sunday when they cut Jeff Green and JaVale McGee.

The Fort Yates Water Treatment Plant supplies water to the communities of Fort Yates, Cannonball, Porcupine, rural households in between these communities, Prairie Knights Casino, and the Town of Solen. The Bismarck School Board met on July 12, 2010, in the Tom Baker Room of the City/County Office Building.

Board President Olson called the meeting to order at 5:15 p.m. In the absence of Business Manager Ed Gerhardt, she asked Facilities and Transportation Director Darin Scherr to call the roll.

Members present: Paul Govig, Lawrence King, Dan Kuntz, Steve Marquardt, and Marcia Olson.

Following agreement on the Agenda, Mrs. Olson called upon Superintendent John Salwei to give his reports. Dr. Salwei introduced Selma Bartholomew of Legacy Pathways to explain how the grades 4-12 Social Studies curriculum was constructed and how it will be implemented in the 2010-11 school term.

Under Board responses to presentations, the Board discussed the possibility of providing a private bus route to Sunrise Elementary School and requested additional information and options to be presented at the annual Board Retreat.

Mr. Hoerauf and Tanna Kincaid, Technology Coordinator, explained the new curriculum for keyboarding and general business applications.

Mr. Scherr requested guidance from the Board regarding the possible outsourcing of custodial operations at the Career Academy. Following considerable discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that custodial services be provided with district staff at the Career Academy. Fran Rodenburg, Assistant Superintendent of Elementary Schools and Student Services, explained the need to have information reflected in the School Board minutes regarding the District's Title I Look-Alike Program. She stated that during the 2009-10 school year, \$857,469.77 was spent for this purpose. With the increase in salaries and fringe benefits, it is estimated that the 2010-11 cost will be \$897,600 to provide Title I Look-Alike Programs non-Title I buildings. The purpose of these funds is to provide additional services for students at risk to support the achievement toward meeting the state Student Academic Achievement Standards. It was the consensus of the Board that the item be placed on the next Board agenda as a business item.

Mrs. Rodenburg announced that she had just received information that the district had received five Title I school improvement grants (SIG) for 2010-11. Dr. Salwei requested approval from the Board to use the Career Academy as a STEM program as the main topic of the next School Focus issue. Board members were in agreement with Dr. Salwei's request.
