Refinancing Truck: Mr. Downs re- ported three options of financing the garbage truck. EXTENSION OF
NOTICE TO FILE CLAIMS

Civil No. 10-10-C-68

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on August 31, 2010, the NORTHEAST JU- DICIAL DISTRICT Court appointed the Public Service Commission (Com- mission) Trustee of Organic Grain and Milling, Inc. under North Dakota Century Code Chapter 60-04 for the benefit of outstanding receipt holders of Organic Grain and Milling, Inc. and ordered that accounts receivable available for grain sold prior to the filing of the claim be included as an asset of the trust fund. The Order was filed August 31, 2010.

On September 17, 2010, the Public Service Commission forwarded a copy of the Notice of Appointment as Trustee and Notice to File Claims to all persons of record. The Notice was forwarded to the North Dakota News- paper Association with a request to publish the Notice in the Cavalier County Republican as a legal publication once each week for two consecu- tive. The Notice was published in the Cavalier County Republican on Sep- tember 27, 2010 and October 4, 2010. Claimants had until November 18, 2010, to file claims. Claims were not received from all persons of record.

North Dakota Century Code § 60-04-04 provides that outstanding re- ceiptholders must submit claims within forty-five days after the last pub- lication of the notice or such longer time as prescribed by the Commission. At its regular meeting on December 30, 2010, the Commission moved to extend the period for filing a claim.

FURTHER, PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT:

1. Any person having a claim against Organic Grain and Milling, Inc. for the non-payment of grain purchased or stored by Organic Grain and Milling, Inc. at its warehouse facility in Clyde, North Dakota, shall file the claim with the Public Service Commission, 600 East Boulevard Avenue, De- partment 408, Bismarck, North Dakota 58505-0480.

2. Claims must be filed no later than January 18, 2011.

3. Persons filing claims with the Commission shall include receipts or sufficient documentation to enable the Commission to determine the va- lidity of the claims. This could include unsatisfied scale tickets, warehouse receipts, dishonored checks, and any related contracts.

4. Unless a claim is filed with the Commission within the time specified, the claimant may be barred from participation in the trust fund.
